Urbana - April 17, 1852.

Dear Bro: Guilez - Yours came to hand in due time - Your request for myself, Thieckland & to do you justice in your Memoirs, after you are gone, shall be most faithfully performed - I am extremely sorry that you have declined going to Boston - After much anxiety & trouble, and some expense, I have completed our arrangements for our party to go & return from Boston -

1. Half fare ticket, from Cin to Columbus.
2. " " " " Columbus to Cleveland.
3. Free passage from Cleveland to Dunkirk -
4. " " " Dunkirk to N. York city -
5. Some arrangements will be made for us from N. York to Boston - We start on Monday at 3 o'c: P. M. April 26, from Springfield to Heria, and right on to Columbus that evening, and so on to Boston - We have the same privileges coming back, returning, via, N. York, Albany, Buffalo, Niagara Falls, Cleveland, Columbus, &c. &c. I go to see the thing through, and may not return until June. We are committed, and if we do nothing at Gen: Conference we are all gone "hook & line" - Miley, Young, Moore, Lowrey, Thieckland, Weakley, Huskif, & myself go - perhaps Lawder - Can't you go yet? Do try - We will take good care of you, and the trip may improve your health - Be so kind as to write to me without

delay - Thicketland leaves Dayton in the Carv
on Monday morning, at 9 o'c or 10 o'c: April
26th for Springfield - and we all must that
day at 4 o'c: P.M. at Xenia - I do hope the
Lord may open your way to go with us - Let
me hear from you soon -

Christian regards to self & family - The Lord
