MINUTES

February 17, 1970

The regular meeting of the Executive Council of the Student

Association was held in the S.A. office at 6:00 p.m. on Feb. 17, 1970.

Rod called the meeting to order. John opened ~~shaxme~~ meeting with a prayer.

Old Business

Slacks proposal--Wayne headed a committee whose purpose was to add a list of reasons to the proposal before its submission to ~~ENH~~ Dr. Banus. The reasons were not unanimously approved.

Cafeteria Committee--will meet to discuss problems, approached, and possible solutions to current cafeteria complaints, Wed. at 3:15 p.m.

Calendars--More are to be printed and sold to remaining students who did not have opportunity to buy the first time.

"Out" -- Bob reported that 127 cases were sent back to the company unopened. 170 opened cases are left to be sold. A group of students will leave from the Student Center Saturday at around 9:30 a.m. to go to surrounding towns to sell out. All those interested students are urged to be there with cars. Gas will be paid up to 6¢ a mile. Each car will be required to carry 5 people with a minimum of 5 cases of out to each car. John Carr will work up the bills to be sent to those clubs who have not returned money for cans sold or unsold but."

Movie "amendment" -- Correction to last weeks minutes concerning the reasons for which the movie Far from the Madding was not rescheduled or shown twice in the same weekend. Dean Lawyer stated the following reasons:

- (1) The S.A. should not bow to the whims of every social club on campus.
- (2) That the social clubs should have planned their banquets at different times if they really wanted to see the movie.

- (3) That showing the movie twice would take away from student study time.
- (4) and that he did not believe that the practice of showing movies on campus on Sundays should be started.

New Business

All school study break--It has been suggested that the S.A. sponsor a weekly 1 hr. refreshment and study break period. Time suggested--Thursdays 8:00 to 9:00 p.m.

Early End to Semester--(~~fix~~ futur) Ferrell to complete study by March 3.

Short Skirts-- It was suggested that rules concerning skirt lengths be enforced. A suggestion was made that it be taken up by social clubs, and dorm mothers.

Speed Barriers--Suggestion that these hazards to car mufflers be eliminated (esp. the one in front of the Music Bldg.) Also associated with this problem: There was a suggestion made that the dip in the entrance to the parking lot behind Armstrong Hall be filled in.

The meeting was adjourned shortly before 8:00 p.m.
