Subject: Report of action of sub-committee on January accepted students for whom there is available a "Parents' Confidential Statement" and a "Financial Need Analysis Report".

1. The meeting of the sub-committee was held on Sunday, February 1, 1970, from 2 to 5:30 P.M.

2. Black students:	#	Am't from D.U.	#	BOG	
Men:	1	\$3,000	1	\$400	
Women:	2	\$6,350	0	0	
3. White students	#	Am't from D.U.	#	BOG	T.T.B.
Men:	17	\$21,500	1	\$600	3
Women:	25	\$42,450	5	\$4600	6

4. The BOG award is contingent on the student enrolling at Denison and the appropriation from Congress for fiscal '71. Should these two events occur it would reduce the amount necessary from Denison to meet the awards.

5. Twelve (12) white students, five (5) men and seven (7) women, were deemed to have no financial need.

6. The students mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3 will be notified of their awards when the action of the sub-committee is approved. Your attention is called to the fact that all January acceptees are required no later than March 1, 1970 to advise the admissions office and the scholarships and financial aids office, in the event the student has received an award, of their intention either to enroll or not enroll.
