

ISRAEL VISA APPLICATION OF THE REVEREND  
RALPH T. HENLEY, MINISTER OF THE CHURCH OF CHRIST

The Department of State approached the Israel Government and asked for an explanation of the reported denial by Israel authorities of a visa to the Reverend Ralph T. Henley, Minister of the West Rome Church of Christ, West Rome, Georgia. On March 20, 1959 the Israel Government informed the Department that it had authorized its Consul at Atlanta, Georgia to issue a temporary residence visa to Mr. Henley, as he had requested. The Department believes that this matter has now been satisfactorily resolved.
