
From your letter I judge that Prince George is certainly a growing town. It should present very good opportunities for church growth.

May I assure you and the brethren there that I would be glad to come to Prince George and work as soon as possible. As I mentioned, I am working in mission areas in South Georgia. I am to go to Douglas the 20th of this month. I would want to give the Douglas church at least two months notice before leaving to come to Prince George. Also, I am to hold a meeting for the church in Carbondale, Illinois this October. I would not want to cancel that this late. These are the only two factors that would hinder our moving there immediately.

Unless you have something definite in mind, our big problem may be working out the support. At the present I do not know of any churches interested in supporting a man in that area. If you know of any, I'll be glad to contact them. Also, I would be willing to support myself if work could be found that would give me enough free time to help the church.

Again may I assure you of my interest in the work there. I hope and pray that the eleven Christians there may remain faithful, and that many more can be added unto them.
