
Dear Archie:

Our office has been in such confusion since I returned from vacation that I haven't had time to answer your mustion regarding the Liberian report. Obviously I will not be able to be with you on that Sunday due to the demands of our work here. I would love nothing better than being there. Rosevelt and Andrew became even more genuine friends of mine as a result of that trip than ever before. I know they will thrill the membership at Decatur with their report. I deeply regret that I cannot make it for that Sunday.

Things continue to go well with us here. The burdens are great but the opportunities are also. I covet your continual thoughtfulness of us before the throne of God as we remember you and the great work being done by the Decatur congregation. Thank you so much for the Christlike spirit manifested throughout the difficulties, throughout the time of tension caused by our decision not to move. In talking to Steve by telephone I have again seen the worthiness of what is planned and what is being done in Atlanta. You have our prayers and greatest respect.
