Dear John Allen,

Thank you so much for your wonderful note. Paul and I are doing very well - still on cloud nine!

Congregation is progressing - we had 43 in church Sunday; collection was \$ 3.25 (\$2 from the Williams). I had 15 children (our highest children's attendance has been 27, lowest 10 - we seem never to get the same kids twice). The ladies are now meeting as a group to study and work for the church (repair song books, make curtains to start). We have a Mission Study group - they plan to visit members, work at the building, socialize, etc. The Bible College is open - Paul, Nick, Dunnen, Langford are the teachers. Attendance small but steady.

Four baptisms last Sunday in April. One on May 3. One confession Sunday.

We're short on Sunday School materials. Bounce Brown has sent some teacher manuals, Valerie Shelton has mailed some.

We hear from A. J. each month on the 6th,
from Bro Willis each month. Caney writes often.

We miss all very much. Please write
if you get a moment. How's the wife and
family. Give them ~~our~~ regards. People
still ask about you and the campaign people -
why isn't Bro. Chalk on the radio any more.
Baxter is... well, he's not you.

Pray for us. We think of you often.
