I feel so strongly about your commitments to Christ and about what the commitments of your family are going to mean to many, many people in the years ahead.

The idea of the inner-city church sounds like a great one. I am not sure that the University elders have either the commitment or the insights to do it, but I suppose that's better than nothing at all.

I do hope that you are going to to be able to get a clear cut answer on what the Lord wants you to do about your law school plans or whatever he wants you to do. I sure hope ole Sue will keep her mind open about the possibilities of you coming back here, if that's what the Lord wants you to do. Tell her I'm praying especially for her to be sensitive to what he wants you all to do and not to block out any possibilities.

Mamie continues to be a wonderful wife and mother. She is really enjoying reading the New Testament (Reach Out Version) trying to block out any preconceived ideas and reading as though it was written to her today. She's really "on fire for the Lord" and it's great to see the Spirit working in her.

It looks very possible that a congregation will remain at the present Hillsboro location. The University Elders have asked that before the property is turned over to a real-estate agent, that they be given first right of refusal. I would certainly want to stay and be a part of making that a real "Inner City" congregation trying to serve the University community as well as the black community that is moving into that area. Pray for us towards that end. It will be interesting to see what develops.
