Dear Allen:

John Allen Chalk and I acknowledge receipt of your letters and have made some tentative plans to meet with you and the other elders.

We propose the following schedule:

- (1) That we have an all-day meeting Saturday, October 29. John Allen will be flying in from Atlanta either late Friday night or early Saturday morning. I will come in from Dallas Friday evening. We could begin our meeting at any time you men suggest. This would permit us time to visit the Bronx and discuss the situation in depth.
- (2) That John Allen Chalk would preach at the two Sunday services, and I would teach the adult class if you should want me to.
- (3) Then we would stay over in New York on Monday to investigate the possibilities of our schooling, particularly in the case of John Allen. This would also give us time for a follow-up meeting with you men, if necessary.

Again, Allen, let me stress the fact that the nature of our visit ought to be kept confidential. If the elders agree to this schedule, then you could simply announce that two visiting preachers will be in the New York area on October 30 and have been invited to be guest speakers at the Queens church.
