I would like you to participate in the Restoration Preaching Record Library.

Don Dewelt and I have been praying and planning for some time about initiating this venture. We will produce one record per month in a continuing series. Each record will contain two 25-minute messages by well-known preachers. They will be distributed on a club-type basis at \$2.99 each (perhaps less, depending on costs). Will you make one of the records in the first 12-month series? We will pay you \$100 for making the tapes of the two messages.

It is our wish that one of the messages be on a unique facet of the restoration plea--the kind of Bible preaching that has been characteristic of this grand movement. The second message is to be on contempowary issues in the light of revealed truth, relating the eternal Good News to the needs of modern man.

I want this series of records to be representative of all segments of the restoration movement. Invitations have gone to various men of outstanding ability. The day will come when Restoration Preaching Record Library will be regarded as a significant contribution to the preservation of restoration preaching for future generations.

The dabaccoff the twelve men who will make the first year's series will depend on those who respond promptly. In case of duplication of choice of topics, the first to be received will be accepted and the duplicate returned for a second bhases.

If you will consent to participate in what we think will be an historic record series I need to hear from you immediately. Your topics (texts and themes) will be needed before December 15. Tapes will be made after the first aff the year. I will notify you in ample time to prepare them (taping will be done at a professional studio near you, at our cost).
