I have just read a galley proof, sent to me by a friend, of Chap. 10 of Ira Y. Rice, Jr's Vol. II "AX ON THE ROOT." This chapter is entitled, "Is Jimmie Meddling When He Should Be Listening?"

What Brother Rice says is a bit rough as you would expect it to be, and the bad spirit of my forefathers rises up in me - I'll never out-live it - to do battle but our work - ACTION family - has now become larger than any one of our personal feelings. To that end I have promised myself that I shall make no mention of this chapter whatsover but in order to live up to it, I need a note from each of you supporting me - please.
