Dear Bro Chalk.

I want to apologize to you for not having been able to send to you \$2.00 each month to apply on your wonderful Radio and T.V. Program, but I feel very sorry on my part as I have a cancer on my lip and I went to a specialist (a very young Doctor) here in Lawton and he has been treating it, and it is some what better thanks be to God, and I intend to try, and send you \$2.00 this next month to apply on "Our Program" thank you so much for Herald of Truth of Sept. 1966. During this time I never failed to pay, as I prepared to Our Church at 8th + Lee, as I always take out of my two checks before I do anything else \$4.00 for each Sunday of the month, as that belongs to God, and it isn't my money, and we were compelled to neglect you, or Our Program. The Doctor started treating my lip in Nov. 1965, and I am going to day for a check up. I am 72 years young, and I don't work; or have not worked since Apr. 1953, but with God's help, I know I am going get along all O.K. I hear you every Sunday morning over KWR FT. 62.1kg. every at 8:00 A.M. just before we go to church, at 8th + Lee about 8:45 Am.

about forgotten those days. I Draw two Checks from
my Government one a Civil Service Retirement Check which
they took out of my checks each month which I consider
I am surely entitled to Draw. but I also Draw a Check
for Disability for being a Soldier in France in the

I am very thankful for. but I sometimes feel very
Badly about accepting it for my Service overseas;
as, I believe any man should be willing to fight
for his Country not expecting any Bonus for his
Services (I sailed it to America) to do what was
expected of me. I have paid my Doctor up to date,
as, I consider it my Duty to pay him an honest
Debt, but from time to time I will have to pay
him for my Office calls. Oh! How I keep thinking
about Bro. Datsell Barrett Baxter health, and pray and
hope that ^{he} is doing; as fine; as, I am doing he was
such a wonderful speaker over Radio, and we hope he
can continue with our Program I had a letter
