Dear Dwain:

I am happy to hear that my lecture is being used by one of your study groups. I feel very strongly about that little work and would like to see it given some kind of use.

I thought I was satisfied with the sermon on the Holy Spirit that came on the last Sunday of January over Herald of Truth. Further study and spiritual development has brought me to be concerned that I did not portray the role of the Holy Spirit in modern life as Biblically as I should have.

Even at that Brother Harper has written asking ten questions about the lesson. I replied in detail sending a copy to Brother Cawyer as well. I refrained from openly exposing "the personal indwelling of the Holy Spirit" but did raise questions and use much of the material in the letter as appears in the lecture. At the writing of this letter I have not heard a reaction from them. I ask your prayers about this serious situation.

I will be in Abilene on Thursday and Friday of the lecture-ship. Please indicate to George Gurganus my deep regrets at being unable to attend the Tuesday morning meeting.
