Dear Brother Chalk:

It was so good to meet you, and get just slightly acquainted, on the night of November 12th. I thoroughly enjoyed the message you gave at that meeting. I understand that things did not turn out so well the next day, but still all of you were able to make your appointment for the afternoon.

Well, I advise others to write you, for that has been your invitation on the radio the past few weeks, and I like it. But I feel that I should follow my own advice.

I do not know just far in advance you know your sermon subjects, but if I could have them for at least a month in advance, it would aid me greatly in preparing for the five minutes we have following the Herald of Truth program. I always make two tapes each trip to the radio station, and will prepare tapes this Friday for Dec. 25th and Jan 1st. But if I could have your sermon subjects for at least the rest of January, not later than Jan. 3th or 4th., I would appreciate it so much. I think it might be the means of creating more interest, if I could announce your theme for the next week, and, while I would not do anything which might detract from your message, or the effect of the program, yet if I knew the subjects ahead of time I might key my few words to properly fit in with the general idea.

If sermon subjects can be supplied I would appreciate it if you can put my name on the list to receive them regularly, or at least as long as the present arrangements prevail in Seattle. I should have them by the first of each month. Of course, if you should get an NBC outlet here I would no longer need them.

Thanks in advance for your help in this matter, and for any suggestions you care to make which will help us (me, especially, for it seems to have fallen to my lot to prepare and make the announcements for this 5 minute period) make the program more effective. Suggestions, formats used by others who have a similar situation, or help of any kind will be appreciated.
