Quite recently a parcel
of Church planting folk, men
here in our home, among
them three ministers, two
said that they always
listen to you. The third
said, I used to listen to
Mr. Chalk but since our
morning worship is at 10:AM
now I am unable to.

Our only incident of
racial violence in
Jefferson City. Centered around
the two gentlemen I requested
copies of your July 7th sermon
sent to.

Dr. Earl Lawson. President of
Lincoln University. (Colored)
& highly respected, cultured,
& Christian. (Colored) in his
late seventies. The other
William Weedon. Publisher
of our two daily newspapers
and owner of our Television
Station and both Radio Stations.

The disturbance came as a
result of an Editorial by
Mr. Weedon referring to Dr.
Martin Luther King as a
trouble maker. The students
black and white marched
on the Printing Office and
did quite some damage.
Yet Mr. Weedon has done so
much for Lincoln U. personally
and thru legislation.

A serious riot was prevented
by quick acting by Pres Lawson
who ordered a ten day vacation
and all students to their homes
in many states and

Buses took them out of
Jefferson City within two
two hours. We have always
been proud of Jefferson City's
integration situation.

How we wish this
series of sermons. These

as Look, Life, Time, Reader's
Digest - As yet nothing written
in any of the leading magazines
on present day problems can in
any way compare to this
series.
