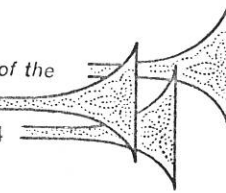

Dear Donna:

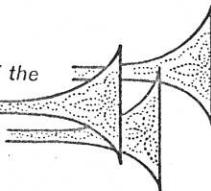
