

Dear John Allen:

Thank you for your comments on my letter to A. L. Haddox regarding the Herald of Truth television films. I felt that Brother Haddox received it very well.

During the past several weeks, I have written other letters to brethren concerning the emphasis on the Caucasian in our brotherhood supplies. Among them was a letter to Jim Wilburn concerning the "Now That I Am A Christian" series, and a letter to Jule Miller concerning the Jule Miller film strips.

The other day I ordered a set of what I thought were integrated film strips from Jule Miller. However, instead of being integrated, they were all black people. I recognize that in many places the unfortunate situation exists where brethren (black or white) would use these films advantageously. However, our needs here in Stamford are totally different, and I agree with you that we need to press for a realistic presentation of the Gospel in this regard.
