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## Earley Child Hood.

Shortly after my farther died I left my home town of Cardova, Ala. to live with an Uncle in a small town of Earle, Arkansas. This complied to my farther's wishes, for my uncle had a splended job with the Ark. power and light Co. besides several Civic jobs of that town and was in as place to give me a good Education.

My life in that small town was a happy one in spite of the fact that my Uncle was very stern and strict in his on belief. He had no children of his own and neither he or his wife knew how to show their love for me or how to correct me in the childish mistakes I made. Of course my school life was normal and my buddies kidded me a lot because I had no Mather or Farther but they still liked to pull little jokes

and no one who could understand me  
second because I saw the other kids loved  
by a mother and father and this of course  
made me feel even more unwanted  
I can even remember when I was about  
10 years old I told one of my play mates that  
I wish I had a mother to love me the way  
their mother loved them. As time went by  
and I grew older I noticed the difference  
between myself and other children, more  
and more and the outcome of it was that  
I grew more remote and kept to myself  
most of the time.

Of my uncle I can only say that I  
knew he meant well but as I grew more  
sullen he could not understand why and  
tried to beat it out me. Of course this  
only made me worse for most of all  
I needed love and understanding. He even  
tried giving me Music lessons but I  
still felt lost and out of place and I  
grew up determined that I was going to  
have the things in life other people had  
if I had to fight the whole world to  
get it.
