Santa Fe, N. M., July 25.
The July number of the Ne Mexico Tax Review, issued toment of all New Mexico ta levies for 1915, with an interesting analysis by Director A. E. James of the Taxpayers' Asso-
ciation, of their relation to th state's new tax laws. The an alysis includes a strong arguments for a state budget sys tem. It shows that the Tax payers' Association, co-operat ing with county authorities an the state tax commission, effect ed reductions in the levies orig inally returned, in twenty one of the twenty-six counties, rang ing from 13-cents in Dona Ana county to $\$ 82,000$ in Grant county, and totaling $\$ 343,286$, 73. The article, which is complete statement of all levies of all classes, compared with these of 1914, forms the found tion for a permanent compar ative record of tax levies in every county, municipality and
school district in the state, as well as for the state taz levies New Mexico municipal levies it is shown, would have scored a decrease ior the year, but fo the increase of $\$ 15,000$ in the municipal levy at Raton, which resulted in an increased for the total municipal levy of abou :8,000
Another article of general in dealing with the financial statu of state institutions other than educational which do not keep their funds on deposit with the state treasurer, but make their own collections. It is show that several of these institutions
are borrowing money in viola tion of state law. Concentra tion of all funds in the hands o the state audit

## THE INTELLLEEVT NANGGE MENT OF A PBBLLC INDSTRTY.

Thousands of Dollars Saved Annually By the Introduction of Modern Methods in the Post Office Department.

The interest of poople in pu blic affairs is considerably heig ened when they learn that the evenues of the Government ar wisely and judiciously managet A statement of economical exenditure which is susceptible of proof will always attack atten ion and please the thoughtiu rader.
Among the varied industrial nterprises of the Post Office Department in Washington is n establishment devoted entiry to the manufacture of mail ocks and the bag attachments in mal transportation When this administration came te power, the Department sor ely aeed an improved type lock. The shop was immediat ly reorganized, placed on uasiness basis, and its activities enlarged so as to meet this im perative demand. Within very sport time a new greatly mproved lock had been devis ed and its production begun. The lock in use weighed unces; the new one weighs 45 ounces. As 430,000 of this product have been put int (the Government paying much for the weight of equip nent as it does for the mail it elf) can be easily calculated The locks replaced by this new and better style cost 21 cent ach to make; those now being nanufactured cost $8 \frac{1}{2}$ cents, dir ects and indirect charges conidered, the saving thus show n origal cost of productien to date amounting to $\$ 53,750$. Of the old style, 36,000 were annuaily returned for repair at cost of about 9 cents each. O
the new style, out of the great number sent into the service but 906 have been returned and as these new style locks
can be repaired at a cost of 3 cents each, the annual saving on this itern will amount over \$2.100.
The Department has in this administration encouragee its employees to give their best service to the Government and many instances have recently come to notice wherein the Department has gre tly profited by his wise public policy. In the ock shop a recent achievement in this direction is an impooved cord fastener, the work of three of its employees, for use on bag; also designed for locking large

A 100 million dollar wage increase for men in freight and yard service (less than one-fifth of all employes) is equal to a 5 per cent advance in all freight rates.

The managers of the railroads, as trustees for the public, have no right to place this burden on the cost of transportation to you without a clear mandate from a public tribunal speaking for you.

The railroads have proposed the settlement of this controversy either under the existing national arbitration law, or by refer-
ence to the Interstate Commerce Commission. This offer has been refused by the employes' representatives.

Shall a nation-wide strike or an investigation under the Government determine this issue?
