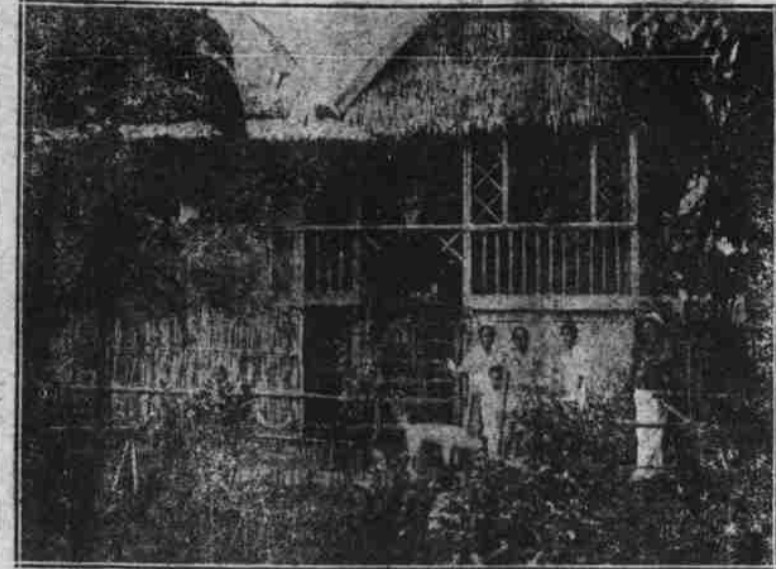

Here's a Real Argument For Philippine Independence



A Typical Philippine Homestead

The United States isn't the only country that has homesteaders—those enterprising pioneers who leave thickly populated districts and take their families into virgin territory to create homes for themselves. The Philippine Islands have thousands of thrifty homesteaders.

The above photograph shows a picture of a Christian Filipino homesteader and his family near Pikit, Cotabato province, Mindanao, P. I. Five years ago he was a cab driver working for low wages at Cebu, a thickly populated city. He went into the then wilderness of Mindanao, planted hemp and coconuts, paid for his land and has become wealthy. Thousands of similar instances could be cited. One Mindanao homesteader is worth \$200,000.

The Philippine government is encouraging the immigration of Filipinos from the thickly populated sections to Mindanao. This is the second largest of the islands of the archipelago. It is still sparsely settled, although it is one of the richest and most productive islands in the world. Many Americans have established plantations there and become rich.

Filipinos are using the stories of many successful Filipino homesteaders as an argument for independence. They make the point that a people that go out into a tropical wilderness with no capital save their patience, perseverance and energy and win homes for themselves, have the necessary stamina to run their own affairs.

NEED OF FARM TARIFF IS GREAT, SAYS CAPPER



Washington.—Reasons for the protection of the American farmer through the emergency tariff bill which the Republican Congress has passed and President Wilson has signed has been termination to disapprove are summed up by Senator Capper of Kansas.

This emergency bill is a paramount act of social and indispensable justice, he said. The American farmer stands alone today of all the producers in the world. Other governments, notable those of Great Britain, Germany, Italy, and Japan, are helping their farmers, protecting and supporting them but our farmers must go it alone in competition with all the world.

LEGION MEN IN HOSPITALS
One-Third Ex-Service Boys in Institutions Are Members of the Great Organization.
One-third of the ex-service men who are confined in hospitals in thirty-two states are members of the American Legion, according to Gerald J. Murphy, director of the Legion's service division, who bases his report on figures compiled in a national census of disabled men taken by the Legion.

"With one-third of the disabled veterans enrolled in the Legion, against one-fifth of the other eligible ex-service men, it is shown that the disabled man realizes the results the Legion has obtained in its campaign for justice for the sick and wounded of the World War," Mr. Murphy declared. "The disabled man has not joined the Legion for the selfish purpose of obtaining his own compensation, for the Legion service is extended to veterans, regardless of Legion membership."

"Although the principal effort of the Legion is to aid the sick and wounded veteran, national and state legislation, Americanism work and many other projects beneficial to all ex-service men are being accomplished by the organization. These movements are expected to result in a greater percentage of Legion members among those who left the service without physical handicaps."

NOTICE TO ALL LIVE STOCK OWNERS

by
THE CATTLE SANITARY BOARD OF NEW MEXICO

By the passage of a law relating to the recording of brands by the Fifth Legislature of the State of New Mexico, it required that all owners of live stock having brands on record in the office of the Cattle Sanitary Board shall re-record such brands by the first day of July, 1921. A failure to have such brands re-recorded as required by this Act provides that they shall be stricken from the records and become obsolete.

Proper blanks will be mailed to each brand owner from the office of the Cattle Sanitary Board.

The following is the text of the law to which your careful observance is directed.

HOUSE BILL NO. 66
As Amended
AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RE-RECORDING OF BRANDS
Be It Enacted By The Legislature Of The State Of New Mexico:

Section 1. The Cattle Sanitary Board of New Mexico shall have the power to and shall cause all brands in actual use to be re-recorded. For this purpose the Cattle Sanitary Board shall issue and mail a circular letter through the United States mail addressed to each owner of any brand now of record with said Board, at the post office address shown on the record, requiring the owner or owners of brands to file with the Secretary of said board an exact facsimile of any brand or brands now being used or oned by such owners.

In addition to the above notice, the Secretary Board shall cause to be published in either English or Spanish, or both, in at least one newspaper in each County in this State, where there is a newspaper, a copy of this act, said publication to continue a least four consecutive weeks.

Sec. 2. Within three months from the date of the first publication of this act as aforesaid, it shall be the duty of all owners of brands now in record in the office of the Cattle Sanitary Board, a fac-simile of the brand or brands now in actual use and owned by them. A fee for re-recording of brands shall be one (\$1.) dollar for each brand re-recorded, the proceeds to be used for the cost of notice given as provided in section 1 of this act; provided, that any excess money from such fees shall be placed in the indemnity fund of the Cattle Sanitary Board.

For the right to continue the use of any brand or brands recorded with the Cattle Sanitary Board, the owner or owners therefore shall, on or before the first day of January of every third year after its recording pay to the Cattle Sanitary Board a fee of fifty cents (\$.50) which said amount is to be placed in the indemnity fund of the Cattle Sanitary Board. Upon receipt of the payment of the said amount, it shall be the duty of the Sanitary Board to mail to each owner or owners a brand certificate for each brand recorded and for which said fee has been paid. A failure to make such payment shall forfeit the right to use any brand. When the right to use any brand recorded as aforesaid shall have become forfeited, the said brand shall not be recorded by any other person until after the expiration of two years from the date of forfeiture. The Cattle Sanitary Board shall give

notice each year on or before the first day of November by letter mailed through the United States mail to the owner or owners of such recorded brand of the amount due to be paid as hereinbefore provided.

Sec. 3. That it is necessary for the preservation of the public peace and safety of the inhabitants of the State of New Mexico that the provisions of this act shall become effective at the earliest possible time, and, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
