DEHORNING THE CALVES.

Must Be Done When Very Young and Care Exercised.

Horns are undesirable in a herd of dairy cows, and if the farmer is raising his calves it is a very easy matter to stop the growth when the calves are very young, but it must be attended to before the little button adheres to the skull bone.

There are some clippers made that remove these horns very readily, but a more humane method is to apply caustic soda or potash. Be sure and attend to this before the calf is two weeks old and make a thorough job of it, for if the work is not well done a short, ugly and misshapen horn will result. The caustic is in the form of sticks about the size of a lead pencil and about four inches long. It can be purchased at almost any drug store. Be careful and keep a paper around the end of the stick which comes in contact with the hand and fingers. With a pair of scissors clip the hair from the bottom, which can be felt just beneath the skin where the horn will start to grow and moisten the piece, then rub thoroughly with the end of the stick of caustic.

Remember that this must be done before the button grows fast to the skull bone. If desired a sharp knife can be used to remove this button, in which case it is unnecessary to use the caustic, but a little pine tar or antiseptic ointment should be used to protect the wound from the sun's rays.

VALUE OF ANGOS.

Goats of This Breed Are Serviceable For Many Purposes.

The importation of Angora goats to this country continues rather to strengthen than to improve the stock since it is admitted that as good Angos as can be found in the world can be found in America. Angora goats are bred. They are practically free from the ticks and other parasites which are so common to the goats of this country. Angos produce a coat of which the best and most desirable fibers are made, consisting of fine particles, and in producing justice care and the furniture, and dress goods, thus in

Moreover, hats and many other articles of value can be made. Many of the manufacturers are now producing Angos from America, and the demand for it is fast increasing.

The value of the Angora is considered the most and at present can be found on the hill of fairs of many prominent fairs throughout the country.

Goats of this breed are farm cleaners and farm coolers. They clean the farm of all insecticides and weeds, thereby doubling and tripling the value of lands on which they exist.

Pasturing the Horse.

It is very dangerous to turn a horse wholly accustomed to dry food into a pasture of fresh grass. The sudden change to green food will most likely cause a rapid fermentation in the stomach and bowels. Turn the horse upon a short pasture, where he must graze his grass very slowly. His stomach will then gradually become used to the change, and he will come out all right.

To Save Horses' Legs and Feet.

Careful attention to the legs and feet of the horse during the muddy spring months will save much trouble and labor. If the mud is carefully cleaned from the legs and feet after each drive in muddy weather the labor will be found to be much less and results more satisfactory than will the treatment of a case of scratches later on.
