New Mexico Demands Statehood of the 57th Congress.

Of Right and in Justice New Mexico Should Be a State.

Extract from the Congressional Record of June 25th, 1902, page 7,842.

President pro tem, of senate: The chair has been requested to restate the proposition, and will do so.

The senator from Indiana, the chairman of the committee on territories, has stated in open session today, that the committee will report on the territorial bill, so-called, on the third day of the next session of congress.

Is there objection? The chair hears none, and the order is made.

If statehood should be denied New Mexico at the present session of congress, the statehood fight must be recommenced and be made successful during the 58th congress.

Honorable Joseph G. Cannon has reached the point in his race for the speakership for the house of representatives of the 58th congress, where it is safe to say that he has about distanced all competitors.

The valued Albuquerque Citizen, judging from some of its editorial utterances, is of the opinion that some territorial officials are acting both ways from the middle on the statehood question.

Best for the several candidates United States senatorships future Sunshine state to be in a situation over calmly and sure of election. Statehood must be secured first and at this time the senate committee on territories seems to be actively engaged in putting several kinks into the statehood movement.

The report of the committee on territories of the senate was not a surprise to the people of New Mexico and Arizona. An adverse report had been expected and it now remains to be seen whether the Republican senators who are favorable to admitting New Mexico and Arizona will unite with the Democrats and will pass the omnibus bill despite the disposition of a few leaders to deny this territory right and justice.

Congress is much more favorably disposed towards reciprocity with Cuba than it was when it adjourned a few months ago. This is altogether due to President Roosevelt and the endorsement his administration received at the polls on November 4.

One of the most influential advertisements that the climate of New Mexico has ever received is that included in the annual report of the secretary of the treasury, Leslie M. Shaw, when he recommends that the Fort Stanton sanitarium be thrown open to pay patients in addition to patients from the marine service because such a step would undoubtedly result in the cure of many cases that would be incurable under other environments.

If President Roosevelt would like to have some real good, sporty, lively bear hunting, he should come to Santa Fe. He will find some right real bears within ten miles of this city, to the east and north of it, New Mexico bears are not humpbacks like Mississippi bears, and quite often show fight.

If the statehood bill does not pass during the present session of congress, the people of New Mexico will have to lay in a new stock of perseverance and patience and success will attain their efforts sooner or later.

It is understood that the New Mexico Northern railroad, to run from a point on the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe railway, near Thornton, to the mining town of Bland in the Cochitinding district, has good financial backing and will be built.

It is to be regretted that Delegate B. S. Rodey is almost alone, as far as representation from this territory is concerned in fighting the statehood battle at Washington.

The railroad statistics for 1902 have been compiled and show that there are at present 198,787 miles of railroad in operation in the United States, a net increase in one year of 4,453 miles.

Representative Charles N. Fowler has introduced a bill in the house of representatives which provides for the creation of a tariff commission, which shall not only have supervision of any revision of the tariff that may be necessary, but shall also have a supervising power over combinations of capital and industry or the so-called trusts.

SPEEDING OF MAILS.

Fast Trains Between Chicago and New York Work Wonders.

A Gain of a Day Possible with the Business Men of St. Louis and Some Other Cities—Adjustment of Schedules.

The post office department is busily engaged in adjusting its scheme of mail distribution so as to take advantage to the utmost of the improved fast train schedules recently established on the Pennsylvania, New York Central, Lake Shore, and Big Four roads between New York, Chicago and St. Louis.

An important advantage of the trains between New York and St. Louis is at the east end, where it enables a closing of the mail about six hours later, during which time an enormous amount of mail accumulates in New York, all of which is advanced in delivery one business day in St. Louis.

Columbus is reached at 4 p. m. instead of 1:40 a. m. the following day; Indianapolis at 8 p. m. instead of 6:40 a. m. the following day; Kansas City at 10:30 a. m. instead of 9:30 p. m., a gain of one business day, and Los Angeles at 6:30 a. m. instead of 11 a. m. Mail reaches Cincinnati at 7:50 p. m., as against 2:35 a. m. the following morning, and at Chattanooga there is a gain of one hour and 35 minutes.

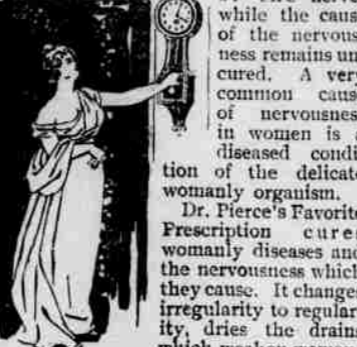
Pittsburg will get the New York newspapers at 12:20 noon of the day of issue, and at the same time there are ten or 12 mail trains leaving Pittsburg about noon which will scatter the mail over a radius of 150 or 200 miles on the day of dispatch from New York, which, under the old schedule, would not have been delivered until the following day.

In St. Louis the gain is 24 hours for all points outside of the business district and 12 in the business district. At Kansas City there is a gain of 19 hours to the city mail.

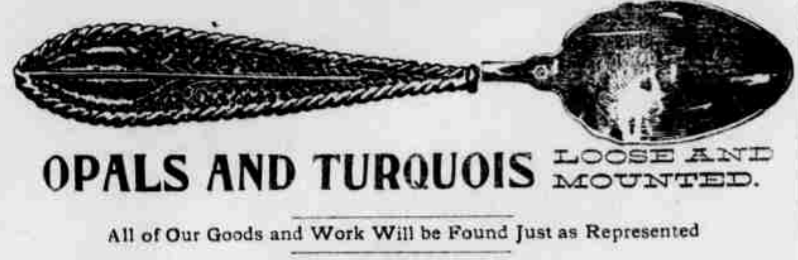
