Fucl of his desceription can. in nearly every instance, be purchased for luss lian loaif the price askent for gisoline.
These engines hase passed the xperimental stage, and the ad. isability is urgently sugerosted that the farmer take mivantage of the fact that they will reppesent a saving in comerative cont of at least 50 pore cent as comprod witligasoline.
It is more than probable that in a short time all important manufacturers of gasoline ent gines will be foreed to work ont designs to permit them to recom mend their engines for lase on cheaper ligmid fuels than gisoline. It is up to the farmer to fored the issue by insisting that ho be given an engine which will operate stecossafully on the low grade cheap fools.
The kerosene and distillate on gines are just as easey to start and as simple in operation as the canoline typee and it is is fact that under tanay conditions these on gines will pay for themsolves in saving over the usp of gasoline about every two to the years. Kerosene and distillate is ob. tamable at ans of the Kunsas. Missouri and Oklahoma retinew ies, They are clocap, ensily stomed, and are not wasted in quality by storages and are not as dangerons to handle ien gasoline.
