tion that these loans should be ton that these loans should be
repaid out of the proceeds of the repard out of the proceeds of the
sales of public lands belonging to the respective institutions.
Territorial Treasurer Vaughn Territorial Treasurer Vaughn
has raised an interesting legal question in regard to these loaus. The lands were given to the ter-
ritory by the United States government to be allotted to certain
institutions for specific purposes. Mr. Vaughn does not believe
that the ptaceeds of the sale of those lands can be used to repay
a loan of money which is used
foan or ther for any other purposes than those
specified in the act granting the
in lands. The appropriation bill
passed by the late territorial legislature authorized the loans
relerred to for other purposes.
Treasurer Vaughn has subTreasurer Vaughn has sub-
mitted the question of the legal ity of these proposed loans to the
court and refuses to allow the money thus appropriated to be
drawn upon until the court has rendered its decision. This
