Sirs: The foilowing instructions are issued for your guidance in the allowance of second homestead and desert-land entries under the act of Congress approved February 3, 1911 (Public, No. 340), a copy of which is hereto attached.
This act allows a second home

A person applying to mak cond homestead or desert-lan ntry under this ect must file in he local lind office an applica on to enter a specific tract ablic lands, subject to entr uder the laws in question. ompanied by lns affidavit uted before an officer anthoriz to admmister oaths under th prectand lans, stating il y section, townslip, umbers (or the number ong utry and land of thit miry and land office whel adt-), dale of entry; when h host, forfeited, or abandoned th same; that it must be corrobor: ed by the affidavit of one nore persons having knowledg The facts relative to thwaband mment of the claim or the re inquishment of the former en ry and the consideratio cating affidavit, which corrob d before any officer authorizer o administer oaths and havins an official seal.
If $\sim 1$ application is present bich has not been executed he ore a ptoper officer, or which ot corroborated, or which therwise formally defecios ou will suspend or reject it mbject to the usual right of a peal. If the application is fur ually correct and the part makes a showing entitling hii the benefits of this act, yon all allow the application, orsing thereon, and on rotice of allowance, the fa the act of February 3, 1911. If the application for secom romestead or desert-land entry is formally correct, but the applicant does not make a showing ontiting him to the benefits of he act of Faruary 3, 1911, you will not reject the application with forward it to this office ion, as required by the comem of March 29, 1910.
