Auto Road From Carlsbad to El Paso

The Carlsbad correspondent of the Roswell News had the following in a recent issue of that paper concerning the proposed Carlsbad El Paso road; The interest in the Carlsbad El Paso auto road is growing and it looks now as if some thing will soon be doing at this end of the line. With the expenditure of \$6,000.00 the road can be put in condition for general travel and reduce the running time to ten hours easily. Carlsbad has donated liberally the last few years to road building across the Plains and found it a good investment.

The auto road to El Paso will receive the same liberal support when definite plans are presented.

This route by way of Queen in the Gaudalupe mountains, Orange and the Hueco Tanks to El Paso will be open for travel practically the entire year as it is out of the snow belt. An occasional snow storm may stop travel for a day or two, but snow does not remain on the ground for any length of time.

This road will also be of benefit to the Plains country of Texas, being the most direct route to El Paso.

Mr. J. H. Wise of Nadene, was brought to Lovington last week for medical attention and is domiciled at present at the Lovington Hotel. Dr. McDaniel and Dearduff are in attendance.

Seven thousand to nine thousand families will be affected by the impending strike of the Colorado coal miners, and as many idle men will be tempted to prevent operation of the mines in to force compliance with their demands.

The governor of Colorado has ordered the State National Guard to be in readiness to entrain for the coal fields. Thus the news of the day forecasts a period of suffering, strife and possibly bloodshed in the settlement of a controversy over rates and conditions of labor.

It is an old problem as old as man, and perhaps it will never be solved. Two thousand years of Christian civilization has wrought but little reformation in the selfishness of human kind and have caught the world even less in the wisdom of socio-economic adjustment. Wealth still refuses to share generously with those whom it employs, still the toilers must resort to concert in order to better their condition and still the public must suffer by the contentions which government cannot compose without interfering with sacred personal rights.
