Warren, Ohio. Feb. 17, 1915.

Dear Friend:-

The Mississippi Valley Conference will be held at Indianapolis, March 7, 8 and 9. There will be a Sunday meeting in the Opera House with Madame Schwimmer the Hungarian orator as the main speaker. A dinner on Monday night at Hotel Claypool, plates \$1.00. All other meetings at Hotel Claypool the Convention headquarters. Monday and Tuesday will be devoted entirely to discussions of practical plans and methods. The two states which won will tell why they won. The four states which lost will tell why they lost. The Southern states will explain their method of campaigning and the question of wet and dry; organization, rural and city; campaign work including team work and individual work; county fairs; press work; literature including what to print and how to distribute; will be among the subjects discussed. Tuesday evening the subject for discussion will be Peace.

It is hoped that a goodly representation from Ohio will attend.
