Warren, Ohio, Dec. 14, 1914.

Dear President:

The enclosed copy of the Plan of Work, adopted at our State convention is commended to your earnest consideration. Please help us in every possible way to put it into operation. If there is anything in it that you do not understand, write and ask about it. We expect to open our Organization Committee office in Columbus early in January with Miss Elizabeth J. Hauser in charge. You will receive due notice of the address and establishment of this office, which we expect to furnish a point of contact for a large part of the State not easily accessible to the State headquarters in Warren.

Read also the Declaration of Principles herein enclosed and get your local newspapers to publish it in full or to give a good reading notice on it. Because newspapers are so crowded at holiday time you may not be able to do this before the New Year. Do not, on that account, relinquish your efforts. It is important that wide publicity be given this Declaration. It will win us many friends.

All temporary organizations, called into existence by the campaign, are urged to make themselves permanent organizations. Experience has taught us that it is the steady education of a community that counts at election time, not the whirlwind activity of the closing days of a campaign. Let us unite our forces, draw closer together, enlarge our field of action and get ready for the next battle.
