Read also the Declaration of Frinciples herein enclosed and get your local revenupers to publish it in full or to give a good reading notice on it. Because newspapers are so crowded at holifur time you may not be while to do this before the New Year. Do not. on that account, relinguish your efforts. It is important that wise publicity be given this Declaration. It will win us many friends.

All temporary argumizations, called into existence by the campaign, are unged to make themselves permanent organizations. Experience has taught us that it is the steady education of a community that counts at election time, not the whirlwind activity of the closing days of a campaign. Let us write our forces, draw closer together, enlarge our field of action and get ready for the next buttle.
