Anticipatory Set/Introduction [Inquiry Question is required] (Req.): What can photographs tell us about geography and culture?		
Instructional Sequence/Procedure (Req.): <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Divide the students into 8 groups.</li> <li>2. Pass out a set of pictures to each group. Each group should receive pictures from one of the categories listed above.</li> <li>3. In their groups, students will analyze their set of pictures and write down what they think life is like in Chile.</li> <li>4. After analyzing the pictures and creating their list each group will share their pictures with the class and describe what they observed.</li> <li>5. Explain that each group had one part of the picture of what it is like in Chile.
