We come to a tenuous time in the history of the Academy, a time we need to pull together, maintain some traditions and let go of others. As I look back on the scientists & science teachers that have gone before to make this Academy what it is today, I am inspired. In 1875, a group consisting of C.E. Bessey, the first president of the Academy, and Samuel Calvin at the State University of Iowa at Iowa City, among others organized the Iowa Academy of Science. By 1900 there were 150 members, by 1920 there were 350 and by 1928 there were 600 members. Today the Academy has more than 750 members, but in these economic times, this is not enough to sustain the Academy. At the present time we must use money from the "farm" annuities at an alarming rate, to stay solvent. At the current rate this money will be seriously depleted in less than five years. We can do something about this.



My challenge for you today is to **REACH** out to a colleague and invite them to become a member of the Iowa Academy of Science and join with the largest group of scientists, science teachers, community and business members whose mission is to advocate for science in the state of Iowa. As a scientist, the Academy provides a forum for research presentations and jur-

ied journal articles for faculty as well as their graduate and undergraduate students. As a science teacher, it provides an outstanding fall Science Conference with over 75 presentations from pedagogy to content and for \$50 it gives each student at a school opportunities to fund, collaborate and present their research through membership in the Iowa Junior Academy. Make it your goal to **REACH ONE** colleague and have them join. Ask a businessman if they would like to become a corporate member of the Academy. If everyone could add one more member then the increased membership would ensure the future of the Academy for the state of Iowa. It is imperative for **EACH** ONE to REACH ONE.





## Specify where your IAS donation goes...

**Iowa Academy of Science General Fund**—Funding the day-to-day operations of the Academy. IAS Membership Dues do not account for all of the funding required to pay staff, publish newsletters and other member mailings, maintain the website, pay phone bills, etc. Until the Iowa Science Endowment is large enough to support the regular activities of the Academy, additional funds for general activities must be sought. If you do not select a place to allocate your donation and you donate less that \$250, your donation will be placed in this category.

**Iowa Junior Academy of Science Endowment-**The Iowa Space Grant Consortium provides \$6,000 to support the IJAS Annual Meeting Competition and awards for 2010. In return the Academy must raise a matching \$6,000 to provide long-term support for IJAS. Donations made specifically to IJAS and proceeds from the IJAS Silent Auction contribute to the Academy's match.

**Iowa Junior Academy of Science Starr Student Research Grants**-IAS provides \$1,000-\$2,000 in small grants to individual middle and high school students to support their science fair projects. The Student Programs Committee provides additional support to these students through grant proposal feedback and matching students to scientist mentors.

**Iowa Science Teachers Fall Conference**-Iowa's Largest gathering of Science educators. The Iowa Science Teachers Section of IAS raises their own funds to put on this conference each year. Donations to ISTS will assist in bringing in guest luncheon speakers and other event programming.

**Iowa Science Endowment Fund-**This fund was established to secure the long term financial success of the Academy. Donations of \$250 or more that are not designated specifically for other projects are automatically placed into this fund. A portion of the annual growth of this fund may be used by the IAS Board for IAS projects including general expenses.

**Benchmark Fund**-IAS uses the Benchmark fund to develop additional revenue for the Academy. The benchmark fund pays membership brochures and other promotional materials and activities.
