The North American Review

UNI Continues A Great Literary Tradition

We are no lady, either inconceivably perfect or more agreeably human; so we frankly confess our age; we are one hundred years old, and still single.

THUS wrote Julius H. Ward, editor of *The North American Review*, in the January 1915 issue. It was the centennial year for this publication, the oldest living magazine in American literary history, first published in Boston in 1815.

Some 55 years later the NAR, true to its heritage, has gone through a succession of editors and publishers since its birth as the bimonthly *North-American Review and Miscellaneous Journal* in May, 1815. Its current home is Cedar Falls, Iowa, where the University of Northern Iowa is the publisher and UNI's Robley Wilson, Jr. is the editor.

"There's an over-40 generation that thinks the magazine died in 1940," said Wilson, UNI associate professor of English, "and a younger generation that doesn't know it exists."

Wilson was referring to a gap in publication from 1940 to 1964. Publication was suspended for lack of money following the Winter 1939-40 issue. It was revived at Cornell College in Mount Vernon, Iowa, in 1964, by Robert Dana, a professor of English at that school.

Dana retained the 1940 approach of combining literary contributions with current events articles. But the NAR was too big an operation for a small private school to maintain. In January, 1969, the State Board of Regents approved UNI's purchase for \$10,000 of the magazine's registered trademark, *The North American Review*, and all but one complete set of the back issues.

When the University assumed publication of

the NAR, Wilson began doing things that had never been done before. For instance, there had never been a photograph on the outside cover of the magazine until UNI obtained it. Also, there had been very few pictures used inside the magazine. Wilson explained that the increased use of photos was made easier by the switch from letterpress to offset printing. Offset-lithography allows extensive use of illustrations, economically, and with a minimum of press preparation.

Between the covers of the NAR, Wilson follows the literary-current events tradition. He said that the quarterly prints anything that is of interest to the educated, average reader.

"We print the best poetry, fiction, and essays we can find—and afford," he said. "We are not overly fussy about the subject matter. The lack of money is a handicap, but not a great one."

Contributors to the current series of the magazine have included: two-time Pulitzer Prize winner Robert Penn Warren, who won awards in both fiction and poetry; the late journalist-historian Frank Luther Mott, the holder of a Pulitzer Prize in history; British biologist Sir Julian Huxley; nuclear physicist Edward Teller; Iowa seed corn executive Roswell Garst; and the late Southern author Flannery O'Connor. In the Spring 1970 issue, the NAR carried a previously unpublished story by Miss O'Connor.

Frank Miller, the *Des Moines Register's* Pulitzer Prize winning cartoonist, is now doing a regular

cartoon for the quarterly. His first work appeared in the recent Fall 1970 issue.

Another milestone for the UNI publication, begun with the fall issue, is the newsstand distribution of 2,100 copies, thus raising circulation to 3,300, a substantial increase from the 649 total it had fallen to at Cornell. Distribution is being handled by Eastern News, a New York City distributor.

The magazine was displayed this fall at an international book fair in Frankfurt, Germany. Wilson said he thought it would be interesting to see if this exhibition would have any effect on overseas subscriptions. Many of the current subscribers, both in the United States and abroad, are colleges and universities along with such notable institutions as the British Museum in Surrey, England.

"We have subscribers in all of the 50 states, as well as 14 foreign countries," said Wilson. "UNI is getting prestige and a form of advertising that it couldn't get in any other way. To be able to go into the State Library in Sofia, Bulgaria, and read a magazine from UNI seems to me amazing."

In addition to Bulgaria, East Germany is the only country behind the Iron Curtain to have the magazine. Wilson's wife, Charlotte, who is the quarterly's business manager, listed other countries where subscribers are receiving copies of the magazine as Australia, Canada, Colombia, England, Finland, France, India, Japan, Norway, Philippines, Turkey, and West Germany.

Though earlier distribution was not as widely spread geographically, figures show that in 1880, circulation of the NAR stood at 7,500. It jumped to 17,000 by 1889. According to Frank Luther Mott in the second volume of his Pulitzer Prize winning series, *A History of American Magazines*,

By 1891 the *Review* had reached its high peak of circulation, at 76,000, with a subscription price of \$5.00. In that year the *Review of Reviews* said: 'It is unquestionably true that the "North American" is regarded by more people, in all parts of the country, as at once the highest and most impartial platform upon which current public issues can be discussed, than is any other magazine or review.' It lost circulation, however in the hard times of the middle 90's.

The pages of *The North American Review* are filled with the wisdom and thoughts of many famous personalities, both literary and political. An early reader, Thomas Jefferson, wrote the editor expressing his approval of the publication. (His letter was used as a subscription advertisement in the latest issue.) Other presidents and noted statesmen, such as U.S. Grant and Daniel Webster, are among former contributors to the magazine.

Literary Greats Contribute

Works of most of the well-known literary figures of the 19th century appeared between the covers of the *Review*. Walt Whitman, Henry James, H. G. Wells, James Russell Lowell, and Samuel L. Clemens (Mark Twain) are only a few.

Theodore Peterson, author of *Magazines in the United States*, said in his book, ". . . Although a ponderous and somewhat provincially New England magazine for the first sixty years of its life after its founding in 1815, it became a journal with a wide range of interests in the late 1870's."

It is more than just a curious coincidence that this is the time (1878) the magazine made its move from Boston to New York. Of this, Mott said,

. . . For the first time in sixty years men who had never entered Harvard Square were in charge. But the significant feature of the change was not geographical or institutional: the really important alteration was in the contents of the magazine. Within a year or two the *North American* became a free forum, welcoming all important expressions of opinion. It was almost as close to current events as a newspaper.

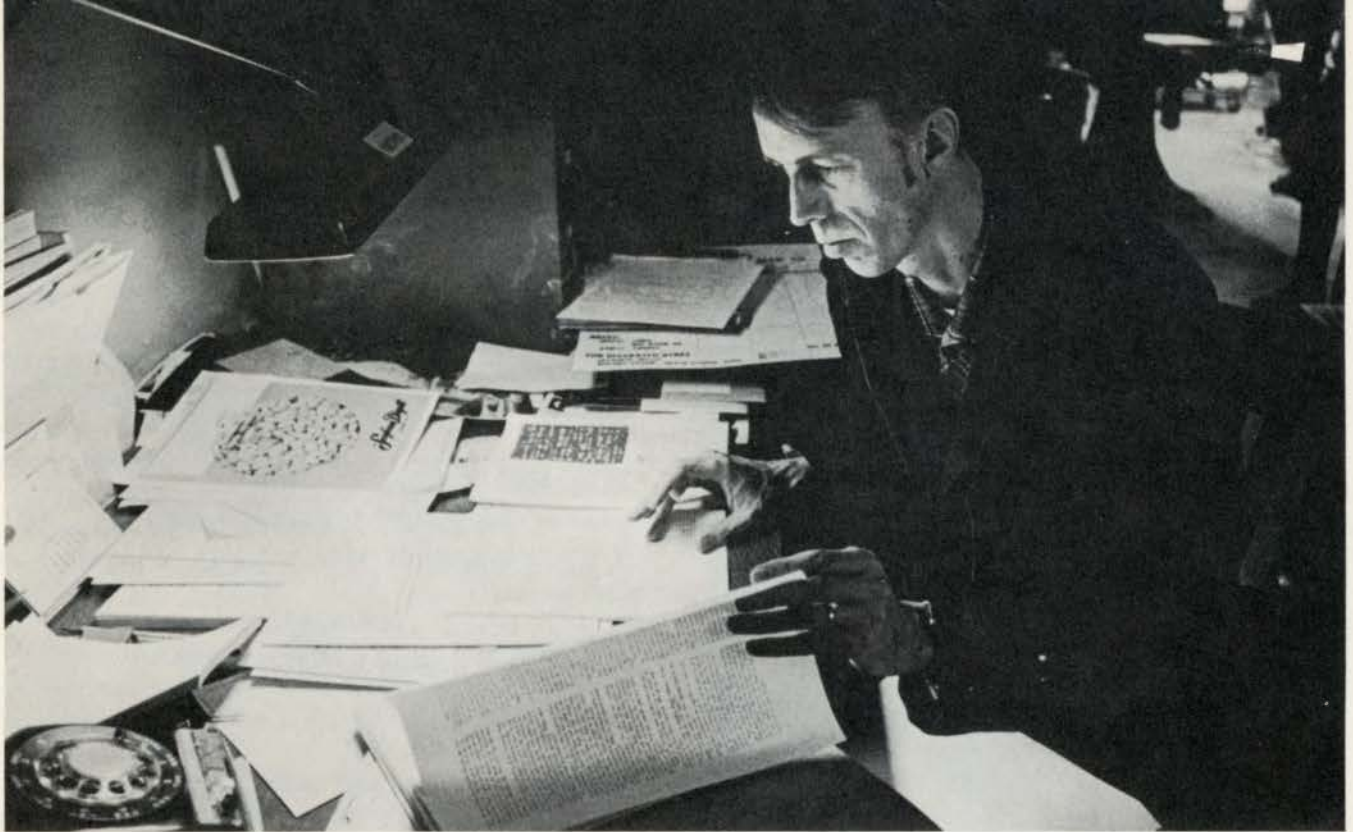
Samuel L. Clemens (Mark Twain) and William Dean Howells were frequent contributors to the pages of the *Review*. Good friends, they carried on extensive correspondence, often making reference to the publication. In August of 1906, Clemens wrote Howells about the *Review's* upcoming publication of his autobiography. (The work appeared in 25 installments between Sept. 7, 1906, when the *Review* began fortnightly publication, and December, 1907, the last four installments appearing when the *Review* had turned to a monthly in September of that year.)

Clemens wrote Howells that Editor George B. M. Harvey would "volley it at the public in the new *N.A. Review*, which I think is going to be the greatest of the periodicals, & the most conspicuous in America."

Though circulation declined, the NAR, in the tradition of its diversified history, continued to offer a wide variety of opinion. At its "rebirth" in March, 1964, the introductory comments included the following:

. . . So, in 1940, *The North American Review* came to an ignominious end—124 and one-half years of honorable and laudable life snuffed out and forgotten because of an editor's commitment. The present publisher and editors guarantee to strive to return *The North American Review* to its position 'as the highest and most impartial platform upon which current issues can be discussed.' If we die, it will be with open minds in honest poverty.

The Coordinating Council of Literary Magazines, an arm of the National Endowment for the Arts, distributes government funds to small magazines. In 1969, the NAR received \$3,000 from

this group for general support of the magazine, with the stipulation that matching funds be given from private one-time sources. This was accomplished when the faculty of UNI pledged almost \$2,000 and the UNI Foundation contributed \$1,000 to this cause. The UNI Foundation also gave the NAR an additional \$3,000.

Circulation Growth Continues

Circulation is continuing its slow but steady growth begun at its purchase by the University of Northern Iowa almost two years ago. Wilson feels that an important part of the operation is that the publication has grown steadily with no major advertising campaigns.

Wilson feels the NAR is unique in university quarterlies, and that, if not now, it could be the best. He said that having the oldest living name in American magazine history was an asset.

"One advantage is that we don't look like a quarterly," Wilson emphasized. "Rather than having the format of the regular quarterlies, we are a 'slick' magazine. We aren't scholarly and stuffy as some tend to be. And I'm pleased we're a Midwestern magazine; we're proving that a magazine done outside 'the Eastern Establishment' can be a good one."

"We do a lot of things Eastern magazines would do if they just knew about them," stated Wilson. "Take Peter Hoffmann, for example. (Hoffmann is a former UNI associate professor

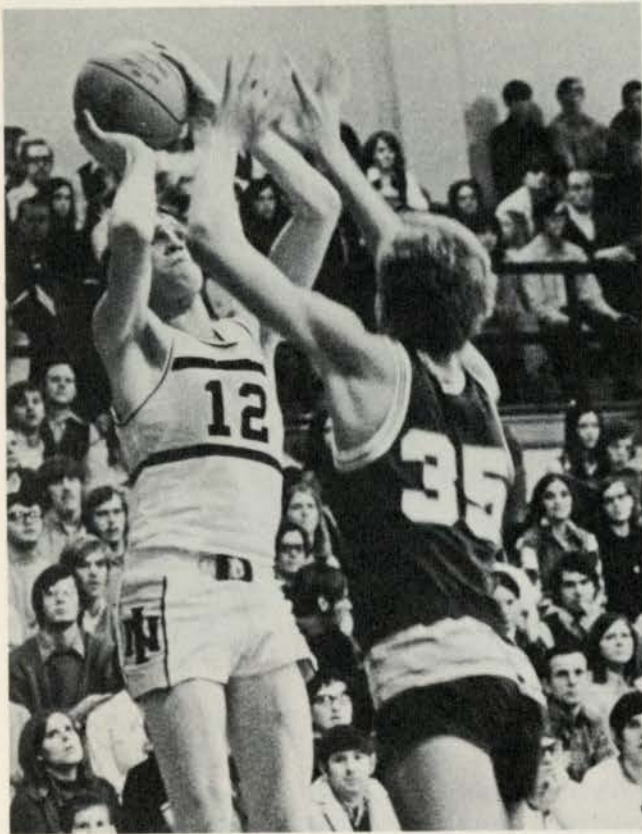
of history, who left after the summer session to assume a new post at McGill University in Montreal, Canada.) He's an expert on the German opposition to Hitler and probably knows more about it than anyone else in the world."

"He has no American publisher yet for his book on the subject," Wilson continued, "though it's in its second edition in Germany. He translated a chapter of it for our Fall 1970 issue."

Wilson feels it is significant that over two dozen articles, short stories, and poems from the NAR, taken from the first six issues published at UNI, have been reprinted in textbooks and anthologies. In the calendar year 1969, the NAR published only 13 short stories, but of these, one was re-published in the "Best Short Stories of 1970" edited by Martha Foley and David Burnett, and three others were cited for "distinction."

The inside cover of the Fall 1970 issue asks the question, "What sort of man reads *The North American Review*?" Underneath this heading appears a large portrait of Thomas Jefferson and a letter in his handwriting inquiring about his subscription. He requested transfer of his account to the *Review's* Richmond office "because payment there is easier made." He concluded, "Accept the assurance of my respect."

The Jefferson letter was written in 1825, and 145 years later *The North American Review* is still winning respect.

All-Sophomore Basketball Team Has Rough Season

Wrestlers Plagued by Injuries

IT'S not that Zeke Hogeland is adverse to diaper-changing—it's just that the Northern Iowa basketball coach realizes that it's just plain difficult to play winning ball in the North Central Conference with an all-sophomore team.

At the beginning of the season Hogeland said, "We certainly hope we can avoid the kind of mistakes sophomores are supposed to make . . ." That, of course, was a clue to the kind of year Hogeland really expected—one in which his Panthers showed signs of greatness, signs which were drowned by too many turnovers.

True, Hogeland did have a good number of lettermen returning—eight, to be exact—but that group included only two seniors, and neither of them made regular appearances in the starting lineup.

But Hogeland's advice is to wait 'till next year, and the year after that.

The Panthers will have all their starters back for the 1971-72 season, and most of all again for the 1972-73 campaign.

And those teams are certain to be led by the man destined to become the greatest scorer in the history of the school—sophomore guard Bill McCoy from Iowa Falls. McCoy is already a member of the UNI "500 Point Club" and at the rate that he's scoring (he carried a 20.0 average during most of the year), he could put Ken Huelman's career record of 1,275 points out of sight.

Wrestling

If anyone knows of a pesticide that will help rid the countryside of the injury bug, Chuck Patten would like to know about it.

Patten, Northern Iowa's wrestling coach, is currently in his seventh year of grooming Panther wrestling squads, and of late, his greatest problem has been keeping his team healthy.

Last year it was a rash of bumps and bruises right at the start of the season. Quality wrestlers like Clark Allen, Tim Dillon, Brad Stolz, Mick Snodgrass and Harold Knaack were ruled out before the year had gotten into full swing.

But what happened? Patten re-grouped his forces and guided his Panthers to within one point of a fourth straight conference championship and then rose all the way to second place in the NCAA College Division finals.

This season Patten held his breath in preseason drills, and for a time, the ankles didn't give way and the knees held firmly in place. But, again, the once-crowded wrestling room grew sparser and sparser.

Snodgrass again was the first major disaster. After sitting out the sport for a year-and-a-half, the 177-pound senior from Mt. Vernon gave it one last shot, only to watch his gimpy knee turn the wrong way again.

Junior Mike Meador also came up with knee trouble, but as Patten puts it, "He's going to have to go because he's the only 150-pounder we've got."

But there was more to come.

Little All-American Clint Young, a fourth place finisher nationally in 1970, became a major cause for concern over the holidays when he damaged his knee in practice.

So it's back to holding the breath for Patten, who you can bet will turn purple before he'll count his Panthers out of the conference or NCAA title chases.

Football

With a few exceptions, most Northern Iowa fans would just as soon forget last fall's football season, in which the Panthers finished with a 2-8 record and a tie for last place in the North Central Conference.

One of those exceptions, however, was the place of senior defensive tackle Doug Walter of Corn- ing.

Walter, who sat out the better part of three games with a knee injury, came on strong in the final five games of the season to win local, conference, regional and national recognition.

For a start, Walter was voted the recipient of UNI's "Oil Can Award," the Panthers' equivalent of a most-valuable-player award. Next he was the only Northern Iowa player to be named to the NCC All-Conference squad.

In addition, Walter was named to the District Six American Football Coaches Association all-star team. The rugged 245-pounder also attained honorable mention in the NCAA College Division All-American picks.

Spring Reunion Scheduled

The classes of 1911, 1921, 1931, and 1946 will be honored at the annual Alumni-Faculty Spring Reunion scheduled to be held Saturday and Sunday, May 29-30.

Librarians Retire

Complete 80 Years Of Distinguished Service

“**W**HEN Mary heard I was hired for the library job at ISTC she wondered if they’d given out the same job twice!”

So said Miss Evelyn J. Mullins, order librarian at UNI, as she completed over 40 years service to the school July 31. She was referring to Miss Mary Dieterich, former UNI archives librarian, who retired June 30, also having completed 40 years of service at UNI.

The total of over 80 years at the Cedar Falls institution is a record unsurpassed at the UNI Library and possibly at any university library in the nation, according to Donald Rod, director of library services.

Both women attended teas given by fellow-workers in the staff lounge of the Library, in honor of them, on the dates of their retirement.

The two librarians grew up together near Grinnell and “even went to the same Sunday school.” They were students at Grinnell College, Miss Dieterich receiving the B.A. degree in 1925, and Miss Mullins, the B.A. degree in 1926.

When the two women came to UNI in 1930, the Library was located in what is now known as Seerley Hall.

“In those days,” said Miss Dieterich, “we just sent our credentials to apply for a job.”

Miss Mullins added, “We didn’t come for an interview, even from as close as Grinnell.”

“I remember being the librarian in that big reading room in the old Library, with students who *weren’t* there to study on those hot nights—and we were supposed to keep them *quiet*, too!” continued Miss Mullins.

Recalling items from the Seerley Hall location, the two women spoke of two “Indian” murals—they included Indians in their scenes—that were painted in a New York City studio. The artist came out with them himself to install them on the walls.

They remembered a “nice big statue of Sophocles,” the victim of pranks they did not describe! And, of course, there was Joan of Arc with her broken toe!

In answer to the question of air-conditioning in Seerley Hall when it was still the Library, the two replied, “Are you joking?!”

“I don’t know how many years we had with no fans,” Miss Mullins lamented. “We couldn’t open the east windows. They were decorative and the sun could hit them very nicely to show them off.”

“But the ventilating problem was terrible,” added Miss Dieterich. “The morning *sun* came in the windows, but we couldn’t get any *air*!”

“There was one telephone back in the stacks,” someone offered. “It would ring, and remember how someone would have to rush back and answer

it? And we had *big* reading rooms. They ran the extent of the building."

"I was circulation librarian for 18 years and order librarian for 22. As order librarian," Miss Mullins explained, "I directed the purchase of books requested by the faculty, and then had the responsibility of ordering additional books. I read reviews and picked books for the extra additions to the Library collection."

"In the first days, I had one clerical assistant," she continued. "Now the department is called 'acquisitions' and there are about 11 people altogether. I have really seen the Library grow."

"Didn't Mr. Rod once say that you were probably involved in the acquiring of two-thirds of the books the Library has?" asked Miss Dieterich.

When the two women came, the Library was located in Seerley Hall and there were about

100,000 books. The new Library was opened in 1964 and the collection has grown to over 325,000 books.

In referring to her own career at UNI, Miss Dieterich said, "I came here as an assistant cataloger in 1930. It was not until 1946 that I was appointed reference librarian, and then I was the only one in this position for many years, from 1946 to 1958. There were six professionals and three clerical people when I left in June, so the department had increased to nine people."

Donald O. Rod, director of library services, said of the two women, "I think we are losing two very valuable members of the staff whose cumulative knowledge of this library of over 80 years will be hard to replace. Both have made a real contribution on this campus, first to ISTC, then to SCI, and now to UNI."

The U 'n I fund, established in 1968 by the UNI Foundation to meet the most pressing needs, has already been drawn upon for \$15,570.05, leaving an earning balance of \$37,440.31. Originally each class was given an arbitrary quota of \$1,000 and to date the classes of 1922, 1935, 1936, 1950 and 1951 have surpassed that figure. Two of these classes, 1922 and 1950, aimed at an annual goal of the \$1,000 quota.

Marvin Klepfer, who was appointed national chairman of the fund by Foundation President Guy Wagner, has stressed that the U 'n I fund is needed to challenge a major 1976 Centennial project, and that every effort will be made to reach the \$100,000 goal this year.

UNI Educator Believes Professors Earn Their Pay

CRITICS recently have accused university professors of not working hard enough to earn their pay.

Dr. Len Froyen, UNI associate professor and department head, feels these criticisms are unjust.

Froyen taught here nine years as a full-time professor before becoming head of the department of educational psychology and foundations last fall.

The 36-year-old department head has worked a 60-hour week throughout his career at UNI and believes other professors work as hard as he does.

He feels the public should hear the professor's side of the story before making a judgment.

Timewise, said Froyen, the transition from full-time teaching to full-time administrative responsibilities (with a couple of classes thrown in) wasn't hard to make. He has always been a busy man.

Schedule as a Professor

When he was a full-time professor, Froyen was up at 6 a.m. headed for the indoor track at O. R. Latham Stadium for a jogging and exercise session with a group of colleagues before breakfast. He has continued this program because he believes he does his best work when he is physically fit.

Professor Froyen arrived at his office in Baker Hall at 8 a.m., and, until 5:30 p.m., when he left for home, engaged in a grueling round of activity.

His specific duties included lecturing, leading discussions, designing, administering, and grading tests; figuring and recording grades, conferring with students, reading and evaluating papers, and reading books and articles in addition to those used in each class.

The professor's day was not over when he left for home at 5:30 p.m. At 7:30 p.m., following his evening meal, he opened his briefcase and began

another work session which usually lasted from three to five hours.

Saturday mornings frequently found him at his office catching up on work he didn't have time to finish during the week. Instead of starting his work week on Monday morning, Froyen got a head start with Sunday evening sessions.

Hours in Classroom Deceptive

"A professor's work schedule cannot be judged solely by the number of hours he spends in the classroom," Froyen pointed out. "The classroom appearance is the culmination of many hours of study and planning."

Froyen said when a professor appears in the classroom, he must be prepared to challenge his students, but, in addition, he must be prepared to be challenged by them.

"Today's sophisticated students are not easily impressed," he said. "A teacher must have done his homework to hold their interest, and this requires long hours of preparation."

Present Duties as Administrator-Teacher

This year, as a full-time administrator, Froyen's primary duties include supervising a department of 28 faculty members and helping sponsor an experimental program in teacher preparation.

His specific administrative duties, in addition to teaching two classes, include such things as individual and group meetings with faculty and students, budget preparation, faculty salary recommendations, faculty recruitment and evaluation, curriculum work, recommendation writing for students, attendance at meetings and conferences both on and off campus, class schedule preparation, and correspondence.

For Froyen, the workday usually ends at midnight. Evenings not spent in his study are spent at meetings with student groups which he advises and at faculty meetings.

"I have always read at least one book a week in my field in addition to the books used in my regular classroom instruction. I also read from six to eight journal articles in my field each week."





He explains percentile ranks in a course in tests and measurements. "The students have to learn how to interpret and analyze," he pointed out. "Transmitting information in lectures is not the only function of a teacher. He has to help make sense out of the information."

He begins his heavy daily schedule with a brisk jogging and exercise session at O. R. Latham Stadium. With him is UNI Architect Wayne Whitmarsh.

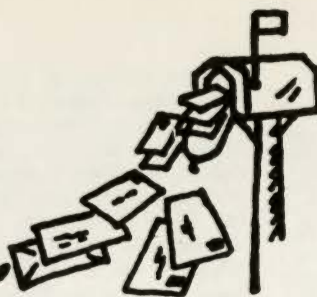
