

### Panthers Aim For Post-Season With Upgraded Talent, Schedule

Expectations for the 1999-2000 Northern Iowa women's basketball team are high after a 19-8 record last season, including a best-ever third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference.

Four starters and nine letterwinners overall return from last season, as 77 percent of last season's scoring and 81 percent of the rebounds return from a team that set or tied 22 school records a year ago. Speaking of returns, UNI plans to return to the West Gym for all home contests during the season.

"We have a great balance between what we have coming back in the perimeter and post positions," said head coach *Tony DiCecco*. "I think the strength of the kids coming back is the experience they are returning to our program. I don't think there's been a year since I've been here that we've had so many kids with a lot of quality minutes coming back. Each one of our kids have played and started a lot of basketball games."

Leading the charge for the Panthers is two-time all-Valley and alldefense selection *Allison Starr* (Wellsburg, Iowa). A slashing small forward, Starr led the Panthers in scoring (11.9), rebounding (6.9) and steals (2.6) last season. She enters her senior year on the cusp of 1,000 career points and will continue to climb her way up throughout the UNI record book.

"Allison Starr has the ability to not only hurt you from the outside, but also post you up inside and put the ball on the floor."

A pair of junior guards anchor the backcourt for UNI. *Kary Dawson* (Sibley, Iowa) and *Nadine Brandt* (Tracy, Minnesota) both started all 27 games a year ago and were also named to the All-Tournament team at the Central Florida University Classic in December.

Dawson topped the Panthers in assists (2.9) and was also the thirdleading scorer at 10.3 points per outing. Dawson's breakout game came in a televised late-season game at Drake, where she poured in 28 points in a losing effort. Dawson averaged a team-best 14 points per game during the final six contests of the season.

Brandt (10.2 ppg.) etched her name into the Panther record book for consecutive free throws (30) and career three-pointers (113) last year. She spent most of the year in the national rankings for three-pointers made before fading late in the season.

"When you look at Kary, Allison and Nadine, not only do they have good range, but they have the ability to put the ball on the floor and be successful. Perimiter-wise, we have a lot of different weapons. A vast majority of our kids have the abilities to shoot the basketball. Nadine Brandt is still in my estimation one of the premier three-point shooters in the league."

A fourth returning starter for the Panthers, *Nikki Spettel*, (Cedar Falls, Iowa) averaged just 6.5 points per game but was third on the squad in both rebounds (5.6) and steals (1.5) per game. Spettel is also the Panthers' top post defender at the power forward slot and was named to the Valley's all-Academic squad as a sophomore.

"We are very excited about Nikki Spettel's junior year. If there was one player that made a tremendous gain last year and made a positive impact on the entire team, it was Nikki. I thought her play accelerated all year long, and each game she got better and better."

Freshman *Katie Miller* (Solon, Iowa) redshirted a year ago after ankle surgery prior to the season. She appears to have healed from a broken bone in her foot that forced her to miss last year, and was the most impressive Panther in summer workouts.

"We need to make sure we have some quality people that have the ability to back Nikki Spettel up. The loss of Britt Stahl will hinder that, but we're real excited about the return of Katie Miller.

"Having Katie Miller come back from her surgery last year will be a great lift for our team. She's an extremely versatile player, but she hasn't had any competition in the last year, so it'll take her a while to get back into game-shape."


 Redshirt freshman *Kate Cline* (Elgin, Iowa) will see time primarily at the power forward spot, but could play the center slot if needed in a pinch.

"Kate Cline is coming off a redshirt year and has really made a nice jump in the weight room. I'm very pleased with her progress. We hope she'll make a jump in her skills this fall. I really like her attitude coming into this season."

Last season, UNI became just the second Valley team this decade to utilize the same starting line-up each game. Reserve center **Barb Bennett** (Ames, Iowa) showed tremendous improvement and consistent play while averaging 11.1 points and 6.3 rebounds, second-best on the squad in both categories. She also set new season standard by shooting 61.9 percent from the field. Bennett became the first player this decade to earn all-MVC honors despite not starting a game when she was named to the league's honorable mention team.

"We're very excited about our centers, especially the depth. I don't know if anyone could ever match the development and the role that Barb Bennett displayed last year. She's had a great summer and really done a great job in the weight room with strength coach Jim Kramer."

Kirkwood Community College transfer *Abbi Schutte* (Sibley, Iowa) will likely see considerable time in the post. Schutte, a member of the MVC's all-Freshman team in 1997-98 while at Drake, is expected to split

time with Bennett at the center position, and help replace graduated senior Karen Mehrkens.

"Abbi Schutte coming into our program is a tremendous lift for our post players. She brings a different dimension to our power game. She is extremely mobile and runs the floor well.

"Our concern at the center position is that if we have to go to a third body for the five spot, we're going to have to develop one of our power forwards and maybe ask Nikki Spettel or Kate Cline to play the five position in our offense this year."

*Katie Sorrell* (Winfield, Iowa) had a respectable freshman year in a reserve role. However, the 6-4 center has been designated for a medical redshirt year after suffering an ankle injury in the summer. Sorrell averaged 1.1 points and 0.9 rebounds per game in 1998-99.

The depth in the backcourt looked to be more experienced heading into the preseason, but took a major hit in September when senior *Ky Petersen* (Avoca, Iowa) was diagnosed with heart-related problems that will end her career. Petersen had been slated to compete for the role left vacant by the graduation of former player and current assistant coach Mary Koch.

Petersen's absence leaves junior *Jill Seidl* (Dedham, Iowa) with an expanded role in the backcourt. Seidl served as Kary Dawson's back-up at the point last season, and averaged 2.2 points and one assist per outing in 1998-99. Seidl is an aggressive defender who has worked hard to improve her offensive skills over the summer.

Sophomore *Fran Reis* (Perry, Iowa) was a candidate to redshirt this season but dwindling numbers will push her into activity. She will play primarily as a shooting guard, but may see minutes at the point as well. Reis saw limited minutes as a freshman, but did average 1.2 points in 12 games.

A pair of true freshman guards, *Kara Opp* (Urbandale, Iowa) and *Angela Bock* (Lone Tree, Iowa) round out the squad.

"I'm excited about our two freshmen. Kara Opp and Angela Bock give a new and much-needed dimension to our women's basketball team, and that's extreme quickness. I don't think I've ever had two kids come in with the quickness, competitiveness and conditioning that both of them have. They both need to make major jumps in the weight room, but I don't know if I've ever coached two kids with such quickness in their feet. That's a sign that we can step up and extend our defense as they get better acclimated." Junior Barb Bennett was an all-MVC honorable mention selection despite not starting any games last year.

Although DiCecco is pleased by what should be his best team yet, that doesn't leave him without several concerns heading into the winter.

"I think it's going to be very difficult at first to replace a Mary Koch and Karen Mehrkens. That will take time to fill those holes.


"I think the major issue that we have to deal with right now is the inavailability to have the depth that we want and need to compete in the Missouri Valley Conference.

"If you take a look at the great teams in the league during their championship runs, they always had the ability to have great depth and that always gave them a contribution every game. Right now that's a definite issue that we're going to need to develop

with some young and probably inexperienced players."


Last year's disappointing finish has left a lasting memory in the minds of the players and coaches. With a significantly upgraded schedule, UNI will need to play better to match the 19 victories from a season ago. Included on the schedule is the prestigious Preseason WNIT, where UNI is one of just 16 teams nationally to be invited. Other possible non-conference opponents that played in the post-season last year include Old Dominion, Butler, Memphis and Brigham Young.

"I think that the excitement in our team is a lot different than where we were last year. The one thing that is in everyone's mind is that we didn't accomplish what we thought we could at the end of last year. We feel right now that we have the ability to look down the road and that this team can play in some postseason tournaments if they continue to develop. We want to be at our best at the end of the season."

#### HEAD COACH TONY DICECCO



Tony DiCecco -- Head Coach

Tony DiCecco enters his fifth season at the University of Northern Iowa after reaching unparalleled success in his first four years heading the women's basketball program.

DiCecco has revived a struggling program that went 4-22 the season prior to his arrival to a 19-8 mark a season ago. Along the way, he has improved the Panther victory total by at least three each season while leading the squad to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1982 and 1983 teams accomplished the feat.

In addition to his success on the court, DiCecco has become a beloved figure respected and admired by his coaching peers, the UNI campus, and the entire state of Iowa. Last season DiCecco was runner-up for the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year after the Panthers finished a best-ever third place in the Valley.

The non-stop promotion of women's basketball in the Cedar Valley by DiCecco, his assistant coaches, and players has helped shatter school attendance records each of the past two seasons. Last season the Panthers broke every attendance record possible, as they topped the 15,000 mark in total attendance. Additionally, the Panthers recorded their first-ever home sellout when they packed in 2,225 die-hard fans in the West Gym for a showdown against in-state rival Iowa State.

The tremendous improvements made under DiCecco's reign was recognized by UNI's selection to the 1999 Preseason Women's National Invitiaton Tournament. This season the Panthers will also participate in tournaments hosted by UMKC and Syracuse as well. In year's past, DiCecco's teams have appeared in non-conference tournaments in Kansas, Nevada and Florida.

During DiCecco's tenure the team has added live radio broadcasts of all games on 1650 KCNZ-AM and the weekly Tony DiCecco Radio Show, hosted each Wednesday night during the season at Ge-Angelo's in downtown Cedar Falls. Home crowd support has grown from an average of 267 fans per game before his arrival to 1,155 last season.

The accomplishments don't stop there either. In the years before DiCecco, the Panthers had a grand total of five road wins against current MVC teams. Last season alone, DiCecco's teams had five road victories in Valley play. He has already guided first-ever road conquests over Bradley, Creighton, Evansville and Southern Illinois, and this year will look to add Drake and Illinois State to this impressive list.

DiCecco, the sixth coach in Northern Iowa's 31 completed seasons of women's basketball, has already become the third-winningest coach in school history with a 50-57 record. He should surpass J.D. Anderson's 59-55


record this winter, with Wanda Green's 78-59 ledger the top coaching mark in the program's history.

DiCecco's focus is not simply on-court X's and O's. He's also concerned with the development of his players as young women, and strives to create a close-knit atmosphere among his team.

"Our kids are very close. Our staff is very close," he said. "These four years are very important ones for development for college players. Mom and Dad aren't around a lot, and it's a very big time for growth and development of adult habits and family habits. We try to create a family-type atmosphere where our kids can feel comfortable in coming to us with problems or excitement."

A 1971 graduate of Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa, DiCecco arrived at UNI from Creighton University, where he served as an assistant coach for six seasons. During his tenure at Creighton, the Lady Jays compiled a 122-52 record, including two regular-season Western Athletic Conference (WAC) championships, one WAC Tournament Championship and two NCAA tournament appearances. Nine players were named first-team All-Missouri Valley Conference or All-Western Athletic Conference during his time with the Lady Jays.

While at Creighton, his responsibilities included on-floor practice and game coaching, recruiting and academic coordinator and assistant director of basketball camps. DiCecco was also involved in developing and implementing "We'll be There," "Adopta-School" and "Fun to Read" programs, allowing the women's basketball team to interact with students to promote drug-free awareness and education awareness in the Omaha area.

While coaching, DiCecco developed a four-year promotional program to elevate awareness of the women's basketball program in the Omaha area.

Through interaction with the community and school groups, attendance at women's basketball games doubled during the first year of his promotions. As well, he directed all phases of the season ticket program, assisted with advertising sales for the game program and was instrumental in establishing a youth support group for the team.

At Northern Iowa, DiCecco has had 15 players named to the Missouri Valley Conference Academic All-Conference teams.

"Our number one objective is to make sure that our girls graduate. We do everything in our power to make all UNI's resources available to our studentathletes."

The program's assistant coaches work closely with the Academic Advising staff to monitor the academic progress of all players in the program. All incoming freshmen, any player with a grade point deemed too low, and any player who wants organized study time are able to work at organized study tables to seek help.

"We feel the adjustment from high school to college academics is something kids probably need help with. We feel it's very beneficial for all our freshmen to come in and gain an understanding about study habits. We also feel that if you prove yourself in the classroom, study table is not mandatory. However, if the grade point falls below what we feel is acceptable, then we have study table to fall back on."

Prior to his arrival at Creighton, DiCecco was the head girls' basketball coach at Montezuma High School in Montezuma, Iowa. He compiled a 306-69 record, including eight conference, 10 sectional and two regional championships. His teams made two Iowa State Tournament appearances.

In addition, he served as the head girls softball coach from 1974-86 at Montezuma and was head coach at West Central High in Maynard, Iowa from 1971-73. His 1973 team finished third in the Iowa State Softball Tournament.

He taught physical education and social studies at a variety of levels at both Montezuma and West Central.

DiCecco, a native of Niagara, NY, resides in Cedar Falls with his wife of 30 years, Kristi.

### "Tony D." on UNI Basketball...

#### WHY CHOOSE UNI?

"I think the biggest plus a prospective student-athlete could see at the University of Northern Iowa is the university itself. Whether you're a student-athlete or a normal student, I think the facilities, the location and the activities that take place on campus are just incredible. The experience that each student-athlete has at Northern Iowa is very, very important to me; we want to make that four-year experience the best a player can have.

"UNI provides a great atmosphere and a great environment for a student to grow in so many areas, whether it's athletically, academically, or socially. The university itself is a great size. People may perceive 13,000 as a large school, but UNI gives a student the best of both worlds. The campus is fairly compact, and our class sizes are in the 40-50 student range.

"As a student-athlete, you want to look at location, opportunities and development. I think UNI gives you everything that way. When you throw in the family atmosphere the team has and a coaching staff that is very concerned about each kid having a great experience, I can't say there's a better place than the University of Northern Iowa."

#### TYPICAL DAY DURING THE SEASON

"Our practice block rotates on a yearly basis; we either go at 1-3:30 or at 3:30-6. Most of our players have morning classes, and if we practice at 3:30, their last class will be at 1 p.m. They're usually over in the gym around 2:00, getting ready for practice.

"Our practices are normally about two hours in length. They are very, very intense practices. We want to take advantage of our coaches; I have a great staff with Tanya, Colleen, Kelley and our student assistants. Our philosophy in practice is that we want to do everything that we can to master the fundamentals, so we work on passing, dribbling and individual defensive drills.

"We do a lot of what we call "breakdown work," in groups of three or four players. At the end of practice, we don't run sprints, because we feel that if each player understands playing hard in practice and getting after it in all the drills, she'll take care of the conditioning we want."

#### **COACHING PHILOSOPHY**

"My philosophy is based on the idea that I want to teach each player the game of basketball and give her tools to be successful in the game of life. I feel the more prepared you are in the skills you need to play the game, the better you will be. I think it's very important each kid understands her responsibilities to our program, and that translates to society as well. People have a responsibility to themselves, they have a responsibility to their teammates, they have a responsibilities, the better everyone will be.

"Taking the responsibility issue a little further, I think it's important for people to be excited about what they're doing. I think when you create that excitement and passion and love for what you do and you create it more days in a row than you don't, you have a great chance at being successful. It doesn't matter whether it's basketball, whether it's academics, or whether it's when you finally get out into the workforce; it's the most important thing we can teach these kids.

"There will come a time when you'll have a job. If you're excited about your job and about going to work every day, if you're enthused about what you're doing and you have that love for your job and you care enough to want to make it the best, you will succeed. If we can incorporate that into our players' thinking and their basketball philosophy, I think we've done a great job with each kid who comes through our program."

#### Assistant Coaches



Colleen Heimstead Assistant Coach

Colleen Heimstead is beginning her eighth season as an assistant coach at Northern Iowa, giving her the most tenure at UNI of any current basketball player or coach.

As a coach, Heimstead is responsible for UNI's post players. She serves as the Panthers recruiting coordinator, is the co-director for the UNI summer basketball camps and also assists with scouting.

Heimstead came to UNI in 1992 as a gradute assistant. One year later, she was elevated to her current full-time status. She was the only coach retained in 1995 when Tony DiCecco was hired to lead the program.

On the floor, Heimstead was a four-year letterwinner at Southern Illinois University from 1988-92. The two-time captain started 81 of 124 games and still ranks eighth on the SIU carer assist list with 309. In the four years at SIU, Heimstead's teams were 82-38 (.683), including a 57-15 (.792) mark in league play. Twice the Salukis made appearances in the NCAA Tournament. She received her Biological Sciences degree in 1992.

Heimstead is a native of Elk Mound, Wis., where she played high school basketball for her dad, Ted Heimstead.

Heimstead resides in Cedar Falls.

Warren resides in Cedar Falls.



Kelley Westhoff returns to the program with a promotion to fulltime assistant coach, after serving as the Panthers' graduate assistant coach the last two seasons.

Westhoff's responsibilities include coordinating the Panthers' study table, scheduling facilities and monitoring academic progress. She is also UNI's contact for film exchange and the Panthers' Adopt-a-School program.

Westhoff remains one of the great players in UNI's history. A 1997 graduate of UNI, Westhoff was a four-year letterwinner and co-captained the team her junior and senior seasons. She set five school records in her time, including assists in a game (13), season (180) and career (475). She also owns the standard for assists per game in a season (7.20) and career (4.57). Additionally, her record of eight steals in a game was tied last season by Allison Starr.

A two-time all-academic selection by the Missouri Valley Conference, the Dubuque native earned All-Missouri Valley Conference Honorable Mention honors in 1996-97.

As a prep at Dubuque Wahlert High, Westhoff set school records for assists and steals and was selected to both the Iowa All-Star team and the Iowa Select team her senior season. She ranked second in the state in assists her senior year at Wahlert and was named to all-conference and all-area teams. Westhoff resides in Cedar Falls.


senior.

## Panthers Close Historic Season Third In Valley

IMPRESSIVE 7-0 START EVER LEADS TO 19 WINS, NUMEROUS RECORDS

The University of Northern Iowa women's basketball team closed one of its most successful seasons ever with a 19-8 mark, including a bestever 12-6, third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference.

UNI opened the season with an impressive 7-0 start, downing opponents by an average of 28 points per game. Included in the run were a pair of victories at the Central Florida University Classic, as well as road wins at Tulsa and Chicago State.

The Panthers lost its first game of the season to #16 Iowa State, 80-73, but not before setting a school record with a sellout crowd of 2,225 fans packed into the West Gym. UNI dropped their Missouri Valley Conference opener to Indiana State, 63-58 in the West Gym.

UNI caught fire with seven wins in the next eight games, including second-ever victories at

Bradley and Southern Illinois. UNI also had an impressive third week of January, sweeping two-time defending MVC champ Drake and Creighton, and following that up with a win at Wichita State.

February opened with three wins in four games, the only setback being a lastsecond loss to upstart Evansville. In the process, the Panthers picked up their first-ever win at Creighton, 66-55.

UNI carried the momentum for a late-season battle at Drake that was televised on Fox Sports. UNI led by as much as 11 in the first half, but could not withstand a furious Bulldogs comeback as they succumbed 81-69.

The Panthers rebounded from that tough loss with a win against Wichita State on Senior Night and avenged an earlier defeat with a 75-66 road victory over Indiana State. With sole possession of third place locked up, the Panthers dropped the conference finale to Illinois State, 74-61 in Normal.

For the first time ever, UNI entered Missouri Valley Conference Tournament play as a favorite, but had to face a dangerous #6 seed in Indiana State. The Sycamores, still smarting from a defeat to the Panthers on its home floor a week earlier, downed UNI




61-58 in an epic overtime contest.

With a 19-8 overall record and 12-6 mark in the Valley, UNI maintained hope for a first-ever post-season bid. The NCAA selected MVC Tournament champ Evansville and regular season champ Southwest Missouri State to the "Big Dance." The NIT, expanded to 32 teams, took four teams from the MVC, but bypassed the University of Northern Iowa. Instead, the NIT selected Drake, Indiana State, Wichita State and Creighton for postseason play, effectively ending the Panthers season.

For the second consecutive season, junior Allison Starr earned a spot on the MVC's First Team and all-

Defensive squads. Additionally, sophomore Barb Bennett earned all-MVC honorable mention plaudits, the first player in the decade to earn honors despite not starting a game. UNI head coach Tony DiCecco was a finalist for the MVC Coach of the Year, but finished second to Evansville coach Kathi Bennett.

Allison Starr led the team in scoring, rebounding and steals, while sophomore point guard Kary Dawson topped the team in assists. UNI lost just two seniors from this team: center Karen Mehrkens and guard Mary Koch. Freshman Britt Stahl transferred to Kirkwood Community College in the offseason.

Forced to play in the West Gym due to moisture problems in the UNI-Dome, the Panthers broke every attendance record possible, while surpassing the 15,000 mark for total attendance for the first-time ever.

## This is the Missouri Valley Conference

As it enters the next millennium, the Missouri Valley Conference continues to lead by example as one of college athletics most progressive conferences. Now in its 93rd year of existence, the Missouri Valley Conference emphasizes the importance of the student-athlete and is aggressive in its approach to provide opportunities for its member institutions.

Since its inception in 1907, the Missouri Valley Conference has been regarded as a leader by its peers among today's collegiate athletic conferences. Based in St. Louis since 1985, the Conference has been aggressive in the approach to playing host to NCAA basketball championship events, producing a revenue-generating in-house television network, bidding out the right to play host to its several sport championships and landing title sponsorships for those events.

Under the direction of J. Douglas Elgin, the ninth commissioner in Valley history, the Valley has played host to the 1993,1998 and 1999 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regionals. In fact, the Missouri Valley Conference will play host to four NCAA basketball championship events in the next six years.

During the past three years, the Valley has led the way for the city of St. Louis in landing the NCAA's basketball crown jewels. On June 30, 1997, the Conference was selected to play host to the 2001 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four at Kiel Center (March 30 and April 1). On June 25, 1998, the Valley and the St. Louis Local Organizing Committee were tabbed by the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee to play host to the 2005 Final Four (April 2 and 4) at the Trans World Dome. Along with the 2005 award, the Valley will serve as host for the 2004 Midwest Regional at the Dome. On December 17, 1998, the Valley and the St. Louis Local Organizing Committee were awarded by the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee the 2002 First/Second Rounds of the South Regional (March 14 and 16) at the Trans World Dome. It will the first time that the Valley will serve as a first- and second-round host.

The oldest athletic conference west of the Mississippi River, the Missouri Valley Conference has been cutting edge in the area of its television network. Beginning in 1993-94, the Valley took its television network in-house and began to produce, syndicate and sell a televised package of regular season and tournament events for distribution on local broadcast and national cable networks.

The Valley Television Network includes a package of more than 30 men's and women's basketball games and selected other tournament championship events that air on ESPN, espn2, Fox Sports Network, and on statewide cable systems and local broadcast stations throughout the Midwest.

Starting in 1995-96, the Conference broke new ground by bidding out the right to play host to its volleyball, men's and women's soccer and baseball championships. By establishing uniform host criteria, the Conference is able to assist a host institution in a season-long promotional campaign and provide an avenue where hosts can acquire a title sponsor and achieve a profit for the event.

The seeds for this vision were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who gathered at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907.

The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools – Drake University and Iowa State College – were admitted.

In the fall of 1907, basketball became the first competitive sport. Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball.

This season, the league will conduct its 89th outdoor track and field championship, its 82nd tennis championship, its 46th baseball tournament and its 62nd golf championship for the men. Those programs, plus other current sponsored sports of cross country (42 years), indoor track (33), soccer (9) and swimming and diving (6), have helped solidify the Missouri Valley Conference as one of the most respected conferences nationally.

Athletic accomplishments on the men's athletics side include four national basketball championships, 17 trips to the NCAA Men's Basketball Final Four and a 1989 national baseball championship. MVC student-athletes and coaches have become household names during the conference's illustrious history, both during their collegiate careers and, for some, professional careers which have followed stardom in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The Valley, which has a storied past, began honoring that tradition in the summer of 1997, when the Missouri Valley Conference started its Hall of Fame.

The inclusion of women's programs under the Valley banner – the nation's second-oldest collegiate athletic conference – has provided an immediate boost. During the 1992-93 academic year, women's athletics were brought under the Valley umbrella for the first time. The Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference – which began in 1982 – merged with the Missouri Valley Conference and was unveiled as part of the new conference on July 1,1992.

The 1998-99 academic year was, arguably, the greatest year in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference. In all, the Valley received a total of six at-large bids to NCAA championships - two in men's basketball and baseball and one in women's basketball and women's volleyball. As a league, the Valley's men's and women's basketball programs finished eighth and ninth, respectively, in the final NCAA Ratings Percentage Indext report - the highest ranking for both genders.

In men's basketball, the Valley sent three teams – Creighton, Evansville and Southwest Missouri State – with SMS reaching the Sweet Sixteen and becoming the third Missouri Valley Conference school to accomplish that feat in the last six years. In women's basketball, Southwest Missouri State and Evansville – the Valley Tournament champion – represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament, while the women sent four teams – Creighton, Drake, Indiana State and Wichita State – into the WNIT, with Drake advancing to the WNIT Final Four.

In men's soccer, Creighton advanced to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals, while in women's volleyball, Northern Iowa - the Valley Tournament champion - and Illinois State played in the NCAA Tournament, marking the second time in seven seasons the Valley sent two teams.

By sending three teams – Creighton, Southwest Missouri State and Wichita State – into the 1999 NCAA Tournament, the Valley continues to cement its position as one of the premier conferences in baseball. Since 1980, some 36 MVC teams have played in the NCAA Tournament, with nine of those teams advancing to the College World Series in the last 15 years.

Bradley became the first league team to play in the CWS in 1950, while Wichita State, which captured the NCAA title in 1989, has now represented the Valley in the last 13 NCAA baseball tournaments and reached the College World Series in six of the last 12 seasons. Former Wichita State greats Joe Carter (1981) and Darren Dreifort (1993) were named collegiate players of the year.

The success of the Valley is not just limited to NCAA Championships, as the Valley has had its share of Olympic champions.

At the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, the MVC collected its share of hardware. Drake's Dani Tyler grabbed a gold medal as a member of Team USA's champion softball squad. Wichita State's Braden Looper collected a bronze medal as a member of Team USA's third-place baseball unit, while Indiana State's Bruce Baumgartner earned a bronze in wrestling. Wichita State's Einars Tupuritis carried his country's flag – Latvia – during the opening ceremonies.

From its early beginning to its current standing on the map of college athletics, the Missouri Valley Conference will always continue to be pro-active in its approach.

# Adopt-A-School Program Proves Popular

# Panthers Give Back to the Cedar Valley

The Northern Iowa women's basketball team travels to elementary and middle schools to help students understand the importance of education and a substance-free lifestyle.

What began as a passing thought in Omaha, Neb. has grown by leaps and bounds into the University of Northern Iowa women's basketball program's "Adopt-A-School" outreach.

"It's based on an appreciation for what we, as coaches and studentathletes, are so fortunate to have," said Head Coach Tony DiCecoo. "We're in the best position around to be able to express to these students the importance and the value of athletics and academics."

Rather than children "adopting" players, as so often happens in collegiate athletics, the women's team "adopts" schools, in a sort of role-reversal that reaps benefits for both groups involved.

The Panther players and coaches speak with elementary and middle school students about the importance of education and the dangers of substance abuse, among other topics.

"The Adopt-A-School program gives us an opportunity to get out into the community and to help kids see the benefits of athletics and a substance-free lifestyle," said senior Allison Starr. "Sometimes we just go and read to younger elementary kids. It's a fun time."

Once the Panthers speak to the elementary and middle school-aged students, the entire school, including teachers and support staff, is invited to a women's basketball game.

Following the contest, the team meets with to talk with the fans and signs posters and fan-provided items.

"It's a lot of fun to meet with the kids after our games," former player and current volunteer assistant coach Mary Koch said. "They recognize us and sometimes talk about what we said to them. I think they have a really great time and it exposes them to what athletics can do in their lives." "It's (Adopt-a-School) based on an appreciation for what we, as coaches and studentathletes, are so fortunate to have."







The University of Northern Iowa emphasizes outstanding undergraduate education, with complementary graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels.

Building on its historic strength in teacher education, the University has developed a number of outstanding programs in its colleges of Business, education, Humanities and Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, and Social and Behavorial Sciences. UNI also participates in the bachelor of liberal studies program offered by the Regents Universities, and its Division of Continuing Education and Special Programs sponsors classes off-campus in centers throughout the state. The UNI Athletic teams led the Missouri Valley Conference in graduation rate in a 1998 study published by the Des Moines Register.

While maintaining its primary emphasis on teacher education, the University has continued its metamorphosis into a comprehensive institution, with nationally acclaimed programs in many disciplines. UNI's accounting program continues to be ranked among the best in the nation. UNI student groups ranging from chemistry to conservation to public relations have been recognized by their respective national groups for the excellence of the University's programs.

UNI's academic reputation has proven a key factor in its selection to U.S. News and World Reports rankings. The school

was named among the Midwest's finest institutions. In 1996, UNI was the only public institution among the magazine's top 15 regional universities. UNI's outreach also extends to the Iowa business community through the College of Business Administration, including the Institute for Decision Making, Small Business Development Center, Small Business Institute, Management and Professional Development Center, Strategic Marketing Services and Business and Community Services. The Iowa Plastics Technology Center and the Center for Applied Research in Metal Casting are among UNI's newest service programs designed to diversify, expand and strengthen Iowa's economy.

In the global arena, UNI's acclaimed Orava Project helps democratize the educational system in the former communist country of Slovakia. As well, student teachers from UNI serve in over 20 countries throughout the world.

#### THE WEST GYM

Built in 1925 for a cost of \$180,000, the West Gym has been home to Panther Athletics since its construction nearly 75 years ago. After the building got a muchneeded facelift in the summer, the UNI women's basketball team will play all of their home games in the West Gym this winter.

Among the improvements made to the West Gym in the summer were new bleachers, a new floor with new court markings, new lighting, and renovated locker rooms. The Panthers were 10-3 last year in the West Gym.

The Gym is also home to two of UNI's strongest programs traditionally; volleyball and wrestling. The Panther volleyball team entered this fall with a 99-5 record at home in the '90s, including a 50-match home winning streak from 1992-96, which ranks fourth in NCAA history.

#### THE UNI-DOME

One of the most recognizable landmarks in the state, the UNI-Dome has been hosting high-profile events since its construction in 1976 while gaining a reputation as one of the finest collegiate facilities in the country.

The Dome combines the features of a fieldhouse, football stadium and large auditorium. It contains accommodations for a variety of events such as concerts, exhibitions, trade-shows and convocations in addition to football, basketball, softball, wrestling and track events. It has been host to the NCAA football playoffs, gymnastics and wrestling championships, high school football and basketball, the Iowa high school football playoffs, and was the site of the 1997 NCAA national wrestling championships.

The former air-supported, teflon-coated fabric roof was replaced in the summer of 1998 with a permanent structure. Although normal capacity is 10,000 for basketball, seating can be expanded to over 20,000.

**From the North:** Take Highway 63 South to the Airline Highway West stoplight. Turn right and proceed on Airline Highway West to Airport Boulevard. Take a left on Airport Boulevard to 218 North, which runs into First Street. Take First Street to Hudson Road and turn left. Take a left at the fourth stoplight (23rd St.). Turn right at the first road.

From the South: Take Interstate 380 North to Highway 20. Take Highway 20 west to Hudson Road South and turn right. Turn right at the 23rd Street stoplight. Turn right at the first road.

From the East: Take Highway 20 West to Hudson Road South and turn right. Turn right at the 23rd Street stoplight. Turn right at the first road.

## Dr. Robert Koob **University President**

Robert Koob, a Northern Iowa alumnus, returned to his alma mater in August, 1995, as its eighth president. A 1962 graduate of then-State College of Iowa, the Iowa State Board of Regents named Koob president on July 1, 1995.

Koob was a senior vice president and vice president for academic affairs at California Poly-San Luis Obispo, Calif., from 1990-1995. Prior to his position at Cal Poly, he served as vice president of academic affairs at North Dakota State from 1985-90 and spent 1987-88 as interim president.

At Cal Poly, Koob was director and chair of the Cal Poly Foundation and served on a number of CSU system committees, including the CSU Commission on Telecommunications Infrastructure.

He began his teaching career at North Dakota State in 1967 as an assistant professor of chemistry. He served NDSU in several capacities before assuming the vice presidency, including chair of the chemistry

department for six years and acting chair of the department of chemistry, as well as serving as dean of the College of Science and Mathematics from 1981-84.

Koob graduated from SCI with a bachelor's in chemistry and earned his doctorate in chemistry from Kansas in 1967. He and his wife, Yvonne, have seven children.

## **Rick Hartzell Director of Athletics**



Rick Hartzell, former Director of Athletics and Recreation at Bucknell University, was named Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa on August 9th. The position became available after Chris Ritrievi resigned in May after seven years to accept a position at Michigan State University as Director of Development for Intercollegiate Athletics.

Hartzell had been at Bucknell since 1988, directing a Division I program with 1-AA football consisting of 28 sports. During his tenure, he initiated and completed several building projects costing over \$10 million dollars and guided the department through the NCAA certification and the gender equity review.

Bucknell's football program claimed the Patriot League title in 1996 and was nationally ranked in both 1996 and '97. The men's cross country, wrestling, men's lacrosse and water polo teams reached the Top 20 in the country during Hartzell's reign, and the men's basketball team played in the NCAA Tournament twice.

Additionally, Hartzell directed a \$25 million dollar fundraising effort, and Bucknell ranked first in the nation in the graduation rate of all student-athletes in 1995 and '97, and never ranked lower than fourth in the annual NCAA statistics.

Hartzell is no stranger to UNI. He played football and baseball for the Panthers. He received his bachelors degree from UNI in Physical Education and English in 1974, and his masters in Educational Administration from UNI in 1977.

He was a five-sport letterman at Klemme, IA, High School. He has two children -- Nate, 19, and Amanda, 17.

#### **ATHLETIC TRAINING**

The Northern Iowa sports medicine program features top-rate facilities and the outstanding services of sports and health care professionals, focusing on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Merac strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve an athlete's flexibility.

Athletic trainers and physicians work together to design rehabilitation programs for

injured athletes. A wide variety of facilities and equipment, not only in the Sports Medicine Lab but in the new Wellness and Recreation Center, including swimming pools, Merac equipment, Stairmasters and various exercise bicycles, help athletes rehabilitate injuries and minimize the loss of fitness during recuperative time.

#### STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

The Northern Iowa strength and conditioning program is a blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete.

"We want to help an athlete develop sound training habits so that she may develop to her fullest potential," said Jim Kramer, strength and conditioning coach.

Throughout the year, UNI athletes can spend more time working on strength and conditioning than any other aspect of their game.

During the off-season, athletes work on strength improvement, speed/ agility, power, jump training, conditioning and nutrition. The in-season program is devoted to continuation of strength gains and performance-related conditioning.

Kramer, a 1989 University of Wisconsin-La Crosse graduate, arrived at UNI in July, 1997. Prior to his hiring at UNI, he'd been an assistant director of player development since 1995 for the Georgia Tech Athletic Association, and before that, was strength and conditioning coach from 1993-95.

A native of Platteville, Wis., he received his master's in exercise science from Appalachian State in August, 1993. He was the 91 kg champion at the American Weightlifting Championships in 1996. This past summer, Kramer was named National Strength and Conditioning Coach Professional of the Year by his peers.

## Vicki Melnick



#### ACADEMIC ADVISING

In addition to an academic adviser within a student-athlete's major, the Panther Athletic Academic Center (PAAC) is available to assist student-athletes with their studies.

Vicki Melnick, athletic academic adviser, is responsible for overseeing PAAC, a program open to all student-athletes. In essence, she is the liasion between busy student-athletes and the academic resources and offices on campus.

Melnick is responsible for advising student-athletes about eligibility issues that relate to class scheduling, dropping and adding classes, selecting a major and university policies and procedures.

PAAC is required for all freshmen and selected others. It provides quiet study areas, free tutors and workshops covering areas including study skills, time management, library orientation and career planning.

Melnick monitors academic progress through weekly meetings with selected student-athletes and reports from faculty. As well, she meets with recruits and makes arrangements for teams during road trips.

She graduated from Michigan State University with a degree in history and secondary education, and has a master's of science in physical education/sport management from Western Illinois University.
