

PANTHERS' ROAD TO SUCCESS

Three teams that placed in the top 20 at the 2013 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships are part of the Panthers' 2013-14 home schedule that includes eight home meets.

"We want to have the opportunity to be in front of a home crowd," said head coach Doug Schwab. "Last year, we lost some dates when we switched conferences. I like our home schedule. I like our schedule overall. There are some other teams I would like to see included, and we will continue to work on those and get top 10 teams in the West Gym."

TOURNAMENTS

UNI will head to Las Vegas, Nev., for the Cliff Keen Invitational in Las Vegas, Nev. Medal winners Ryan Loder, Levi Wolfensperger and Cody Caldwell all return this year to help improve on last year's eighth-place finish.

"We will be going back to some of those premier tournaments like Midlands and the Las Vegas invite," Schwab said. "I like how they were run. They do a great job, and it's good for our guys to get that competition early on and be able to make a name for themselves."

The team placed 13th at Midlands last year. Both Panthers who medaled will return. Loder took fourth at 184 pounds, and Joey Lazor was seventh at 141 pounds.

HOME STRETCH

Wisconsin will visit Cedar Falls early in the season, and the UNI Open will break up a long stretch on the road. However, the Panthers will end their regular season with the bulk of competitions at home.

"We want people to get used to coming to the West Gym. We want to make it an environment they are excited about, and I think we can do that."

WHAT'S AHEAD

The Panthers return one All-American and two other NCAA national qualifiers with Ryan Loder, Joey Lazor and Levi Wolfensperger. The trio combined with David Bonin to lead the team to its highest finish since 2005, placing 15th. Bonin, who graduated, and Loder became Schwab's first All-Americans since he was hired as UNI's head coach for the 2010-11 season. Schwab is entering his fourth season with the Panthers.

Since Schwab has taken the helm at University of Northern Iowa, the Panthers have jumped from 46th to 15th place at the NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships and continue to recruit the top wrestlers in the nation.

Wins over No. 13 Oklahoma (18-15) and No. 21 Northwestem (21-13) in the same week catapulted Northern lowa into the rankings last season.

A small graduating 2013 class of just three wrestlers, means several veterans return for the UNI squad, including Wolfensperger and Lazor who were one round away from being All-Americans at the 2013 national tournament in the 133-pound and 141-pound weight classes, respectively.

Among the newest Panthers to join the team, two are state prep champions, and a third newcomer has placed fifth two times at the junior college national tournament.

MOVING TO THE MAC

After dominating the Western Wrestling Conference, the University of Northern Iowa joined Missouri in moving to the Mid-American Conference for the 2012-13 conference meet. This year, the Panthers will implement its first full MAC schedule.

The MAC also will add Missouri and Old Dominion starting the 2013-14 wrestling season.

With this increase in wrestling membership, the MAC will become the third largest Division I wrestling league in the nation only behind the Big Ten and the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association.

"Each season, four of the home duals are set by the MAC, and hopefully we will continue to be able to fill other dates with Big 10 teams," said head coach Doug Schwab.

The Panthers took third at the 2013 MAC Championships. Central Michigan settled for second when Missouri ended the Chippewas' 11-year run as conference champions. Both teams are on UNI's home schedule.

"We want to make sure we are prepared for the MAC and ultimately nationals. Those highend teams make us ready so we can rise to the occasion," said Schwab.

PANTHERS EARN MAC HONORS

On Feb. 13, 2013, Ryan Loder, 184 pounds, became the first UNI wrestler to be named MAC Wrestler of the Week.

Jarrett Jensen, 165 pounds, earned a spot on the Academic All-MAC Wrestling Team. His 3.93 GPA was the highest on the All-MAC team. Jensen is a biology major.

THE MAC AT NCAA TOURNEY

The MAC was allocated 30 spots for the NCAA DI Wrestling Championships. The conference was granted another 10 at-large spots.

Out of the 40 qualifiers, 11 MAC wrestlers earned All-American honors in last year's NCAA

national tournament.

Central Michigan seniors Ben Bennett and Jarod Trice earned All-America status, and Bennett became the first wrestler in Chippewas history to become a four-time All-American.

Kent State's Dustin Kilgore became the Flashes first three-time All-American.

From Missouri, Alan Waters, Nathan McCormick, Drake Houdashelt, Mike Larson, and Dom Bradley all eamed All-America status to match the school's most All-Amercans in a season.

Northern Iowa's David Bonin and Loder also earned All-American status. Also, Ohio redshirt freshman Cody Walters earned All-America honors.

BILL RUUD UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA PRESIDENT

Dr. William N. Ruud, Bill, as he prefers, began serving as the 10th president of the University of Northern lowa on May 31, 2013. Listening and learning were integral to his start at UNI, as he focused on building relationships with faculty, staff, students, alumni and numerous community and state leaders. He engaged with the campus and community to determine the priorities of increasing student enrollment, converting state appropriations to permanent base funding and continuing UNI's fundraising efforts.

President Ruud is a member the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance Executive Board, a regional economic community development corporation, the Governor's STEM Advisory Council Executive Committee, a statewide initiative aimed at increasing students' interest and achievement in STEM subjects, improving access to STEM educational opportunities, and at recruiting and retaining STEM teachers.

Dr. Ruud is a member of the lowa Business Council, a nonpartisan, nonprofit statewide organization leading efforts in technology innovation, and in enhancing lowa's commercial infrastructure. Nationally, President Ruud is lowa's representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities organization whose members share a dedication to research and creativity to advance higher education.


Prior to his UNI appointment he served as the 15th president of Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania. President Ruud has served in various leadership capacities at colleges and universities in the U.S. He has used his wealth of experience to lead universities to academic excellence and achievement, as well as ensure that they fulfill their essential role in the region and state.

Ruud began his academic career teaching business courses at Northwestern Louisiana State University in 1978. From 1979-1981 he conducted his research in leadership assessment at the U.S. Army Research Institute; he also taught management theory and organizational behavior courses at Central Michigan University from 1980-1981.

From 1981 to 1993 he served at the University of Toledo. He taught business and ethics courses and was tenured in 1987. He coordinated the MBA program, served as Associate Vice President for Student Affairs, and eventually served as Interim Dean of the College of Business Administration. In 1993, he was appointed Boise State University Dean of the College of Business & Economics, and promoted in 1998 to the Vice President for Institutional Advancement. At Boise State he was selected as Administrator of the Year, completed a \$12.5 million campaign for a new engineering facility, established faculty fellowships, and created endowments to support student research.

From 2000-2003 he served as the Chief Education Policy Advisor for the Office of Governor Dirk Kempthorne, State of Idaho. He worked with the State Department of Education and State Board of Education on all pre-K through higher education issues.

In 2004, Ruud was named Vice President for Development/University Relations at California State University, Stanislaus. He achieved record fundraising levels, doubled membership in the alumni association, raised more than \$10 million for student scholarships, and increased communi-



ty partnerships.

In 2007, Ruud became president of Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania, a comprehensive regional university. During his presidency, the university completed a successful reaccreditation (with commendation) by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education in 2009, implemented a facilities master plan in conjunction with the university's strategic plan, and led the university's development of an Academic Master Plan. The University also increased enrollment, experienced double-digit increases in student applications-including an increase in applications from minority students-and consistently had the highest graduation rate (seven years in a row) in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

Ruud serves on the editorial board of the Journal of Leadership & Organizational Studies, and has published numerous scholarly articles on business, ethics, organizational communication, and business education pedagogy. He continues to conduct research on institutional leadership and organizational behavior topics.

President Ruud earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Public Administration and Hospital Administration from the University of North Dakota. He earned a Master's degree in Business Administration and a Doctorate degree in Organizational Behavior from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHWAB - 4TH SEASON

Last season, Doug Schwab crowned his first two All-Americans as the Panthers' head coach while leading the team to its highest finish at the Division I National Wrestling Championships since 2005.



Schwab enters his fourth season with the University of Northern Iowa in 2013–

He was among 45 coaches who received full scholoarships to join the fourth annual National Wrestling Coaches Association Leadership Academy in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., in August 2012.

In his first season as head coach (2010-11), Schwab led the Panthers to their first 12-win season since 2003 and helped UNI earn its fourth Western Wrestling Conference dual championship.

Schwab is the Panthers' ninth head coach in the program's illustrious history.

"Doug is going to bring passion and intensity back to UNI wrestling. Panther wrestling has a long and storied history, and Doug has the championship mentality necessary to re-establish our program as one of the best in the nation," said University of Northern lowa Director of Athletics Troy Dannen upon hiring Schwab.

"My main job is to get the guys to buy into the lifestyle — that includes on the mat and in the classroom. I'm looking forward to putting an exciting product on the mat that fans in the Cedar Valley can rally behind and come out and watch," Schwab said.

Schwab of Osage, lowa, served as an assistant wrestling coach with University of lowa.

During his tenure at lowa:

- the Hawkeyes to three NCAA and Big Ten team titles
- lowa crowned six NCAA champions, six Big Ten champions, 23 All-Americans and 24 academic all-Big Ten honorees


Prior to joining the lowa staff, Schwab served two seasons (2005-07) as an assistant coach at Virgina Tech University under Tom Brands. During his tenure with the Hokies, the team won the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. Virginia Tech also crowned five conference champions and two All-Americans, and senior heavyweight Mike Faust was named 2006 ACC Wrestler of the Year.

Schwab was a three-time All-American and Big Ten champion for the Hawkeyes from 1998-2001. He won the 1999 NCAA title at 141 pounds and finished his collegiate career with 130 wins, which ranks 10th-best in school history.

Post-college wrestling accomplishments

- Represented the United States at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China, wrestling freestyle at 145.5 pounds (66 kg)
- Won titles at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Team Trials and U.S. Nationals
- Won the U.S. Senior Freestyle title in 2007
- Earned a bronze medal at the 2007 Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil
- Placed fifth at the 2007 World Championships in Baku, Azerbaijan
- 145.5-pound title at the 2003 Sunkist Kids International Open and earning Outstanding Wrestler honors in the freestyle event
- 145-pound division of Real Pro Wrestling, earning Outstanding Wrestler honors as part of the champion lowa Stalkers team in 2005

Schwab was born Aug. 3, 1977. He earned a B.S. in communication studies from the University of Iowa in 2001. He and his wife, Allyson, have two sons, Hayden and Hendrix.



MARK SCHWAB - 4TH SEASON

Former Panther Mark Schwab joined his brother, Doug, on the UNI coaching staff, after head coaching stints at NIACC and Buena Vista University.

At Buena Vista, Schwab was named Iowa Conference Coach of the Year in 2007



and coached the first four-time NCAA All-American in the history of BVU wrestling.

Prior to BVU, Schwab spent nine years as assistant coach at the University of Minnesota, helping the program to seven top-three team finishes at the NCAA Championships and two NCAA team titles.

Schwab also served as an assistant coach at Purdue from 1991-93.

Prior to his coaching experience, Schwab was an All-American for the Panthers. In his initial season as a Panther, Schwab posted a 49-9 record, the most wins by a true freshman in NCAA history, and placed fifth

in the 1986 NCAA Division I Championships. In 1987, he won the bronze medal in what was called the World's Toughest Tournament in Tiblissi, Russia.

During his redshirt season at UNI, Schwab trained for the 1988 U.S. Olympic team and won a bronze medal for the U.S. team at the World Cup event in Ulan Bator, Mongolia. Injuries and illness kept Schwab off the mat for more than a year, but Schwab earned his second All-American honor as a senior.

As a prep at Osage, Schwab was nearly flawless, winning 106 of 107 matches and capturing four state titles. Schwab also earned three Junior National Freestyle titles and a national championship in the Greco-Roman category. Schwab was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame, Iowa Wrestling Hall of Fame and Glen Brand Hall of Fame.

Schwab earned a bachelor's degree from UNI in 1991 and a master's degree from Minnesota in 2003. He returned to Minnesota and completed a second emphasis in sport psychology in 2010.

RANDY PUGH - 13TH SEASON

Assistant head coach Randy Pugh will enter his 13th season as a UNI assistant and has helped develop All-Americans Jarion Beets (174), Eric Hauan (174), Kyle Hansen (184), Jason Payne (197), Sean Stender (197), Paul Hynek

(285) and Ryan Loder (184).



Pugh trained for international competition following his All-American career at UNI. The Columbus Junction, lowa, native finished fourth at the USA World Trials in June 2002 and competed in the trials again in 2003. In 2002, he won the Sunkist International Open and garnered a third-place finish at the U.S. Open. In 2003, Pugh placed eighth at the U.S. Open. He also placed third at the Dave Schultz Open in 2003.

As an athlete at UNI, Pugh finished fourth at the 2000 NCAA tournament at

174 pounds, capping a senior season with a 26-4 record. He was ranked as high as third nationally after upending top-rated Otto Olson at the Virginia Duals.


Pugh was a state high school champion his senior year before enrolling at the U.S. Naval Academy, where he compiled a 16-8 record his first year. He transferred to UNI in 1998 and ended with a 70-17 career record.

For Pugh, the biggest change from competing on the mat to coaching his former teammates is motivating others.

"When I was on the mat, I was doing what it took to make myself a better athlete," Pugh said. "But as a coach, I am more concerned with what others are doing and helping them improve."

Pugh's goal for the Panthers is for the athletes to improve every match and continue to be good student-athletes. He graduated from UNI with a degree in industrial technology.

He and his wife, Krista, are the parents of two daughters, Hayden and Presley.



TOLLY THOMPSON - 11TH SEASON

Former NCAA champion and Janesville, lowa, native Tolly Thompson is beginning his 11th season as a Panther assistant coach.



Thompson was the strength and conditioning coach at Nebraska before Joining the Panther staff as the team's conditioning specialist in the 2002-03 season. He was a member of the Panthers' coaching staff during the 1999-2000 seasons as a volunteer assistant and resumed that role in 2011.

"The big thing Tolly brings with him is the winning mentality," UNI head coach Doug Schwab said.

"He wants to get the most out of our wrestlers and sets very high standards, which fits in very well with the mentality

of our staff. He is a very demanding coach but deeply cares about each wrestler."

Thompson earned the 2005 John Smith Award as the Freestyle Wrestler of the Year by USA Wrestling. Thompson won the 2005 and 2006 U.S. World Team Trials to represent the United States at the World Championships.

He placed third at the 2005 World Championships (120/264.5 lbs.) in Budapest, Hungary and was a previous member of the USA wrestling Freestyle National Tearn. After waiting nearly six hours after his first-round loss, Thompson won three straight matches in his first trip to the World Championships to claim his first World medal. He capped his medal-winning performance with a 1-0, 1-0 win over past 1997 World champion Kuramagomed Kuramagomedov of Russia. Thompson's rally to the bronze propelled the Americans to an eighth-place finish in the freestyle competition. Overall, the U.S. team ended the competition with two bronze medals.

Along with taking a bronze at the 2005 World Cup, Thompson placed second at the Cerro Pelado International and was the 2005 Dave Schultz Memorial International Champion.

In March 2004, Thompson placed fourth at the Acropolis Tournament



in Athens, Greece, in the 120kd/264.5 pound weight. That April, Thompson continued his run for an Olympic bid at the U.S. National Championships. He was able to put together a top finish to qualify for the 2004 Olympic Trials in Indianapolis. At the trials, Thompson rolled through competition to win the mini-tournament, which placed him in the title bout for an automatic Olympic bid. In a best of three series, Thompson was defeated by Kerry McCoy 5-3 and 8-0, finishing his 2004 Olympic run with a second-place finish.

In 2003, he placed second at the U.S. Open and World Team Trials. Thompson also was the 2002 Sunkist International Open champion and the New York Athletic Club champion. In his quest to qualify for the 2000 Summer Olympics, he was defeated at the team trials in the semifinal round by world and national champion Stephen Neal of Bakersfield, Calif.

During his collegiate tenure, he compiled a career record of 157-21 from 1993 to 1997 as a Husker. His 157 wins once placed him on the NCAA's all-time wins list. As a Husker, he became Nebraska's sixth national champion as a sophomore in 1995 by defeating UNI's Justin Greenlee. He finished third at the 1996 and 1997 championships while also winning the Gorrarian Award for the most falls in the least time at the 1997 championships. A three-time Big Eight/Big 12 champion, Thompson was also a three-time NWCA All-Star.

He and his wife, Tracy, have three daughters, Payton, Bree and Kendall.



TROY GARRETT - FIFTH SEASON

Troy Garrett enters his fifth season as the athletic trainer with the UNI wrestling team. This is Garrett's seventh year at UNI. He spent two seasons with the UNI cross country and track teams. He also works with the tennis team.

Garrett earned his bachelor's from Truman State University in 1995 and his master's from the University of Oklahoma in 1998.

He and his wife, Jennifer, have two daughters Marissa (5) and Delaney (2).
