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TEACHING THE ELEMENTARY COURSE IN BACTERIOLOGY

(ABSTRACT)

- 1. The objectives to be emphasized in courses in bacteriology in the probable order of importance for the elementary course are:
 - a. Vocational Practical Utilization in vocation.
 - b. Health. With some student groups rank first.
 - c. Citizenship. Social-Civic.
 - d. Avocationa. Of minor importance in bacteriology in most cases.
- The course should be adapted to the type of student. The content and plane of teaching will be determined by this type. The bases for groupings are:
 - a. Vocational objective.
 - b. Preparation and prerequisites.
 - c. Intelligence and ability.
- 3. Correlation of laboratory and class work.
- 4. Selection of texts and assigned readings.
- 5. Class work and laboratory content and conduct.
 - a. Importance of dividing work into short, definite sections.
 - b. Importance of establishing minimum bases of accomplishment.
 - c. Importance of recognition of students for exceptional ability.
 - d. Importance of eliminating unnecessary teacher routine.
 - e. Importance of efficiency in instruction.

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
