


#### Engage Tool: YouTube - Both examples

#### Engage Tool: ThingLink - Grade 3 Example


A perfect web tool for building background knowledge through exploration. This website allows you to upload an image and then add "hot spots", which are areas that a viewer clicks to learn more information. Ss choose the order in which they explore the content, inspiring curiosity and developing their inquiry-based learning skills.

#### Engage Tool: FlipGrid - PreK-Grade 1 Example

A social learning platform that allows teachers to ask a question, then the students respond in a video. Students are then able to respond to one another, creating a web of discussion.




