WEEKLY CROP BULLETIN.

The first Weekly Crop Bulletin by the U. S. signal service for the season of 1898, issued this week, shows a very unfavorable condition of affairs in Kentucky. Rains have been excessive and most inclement since March 15th, greatly retarding plowing, planting, and all farming operations.

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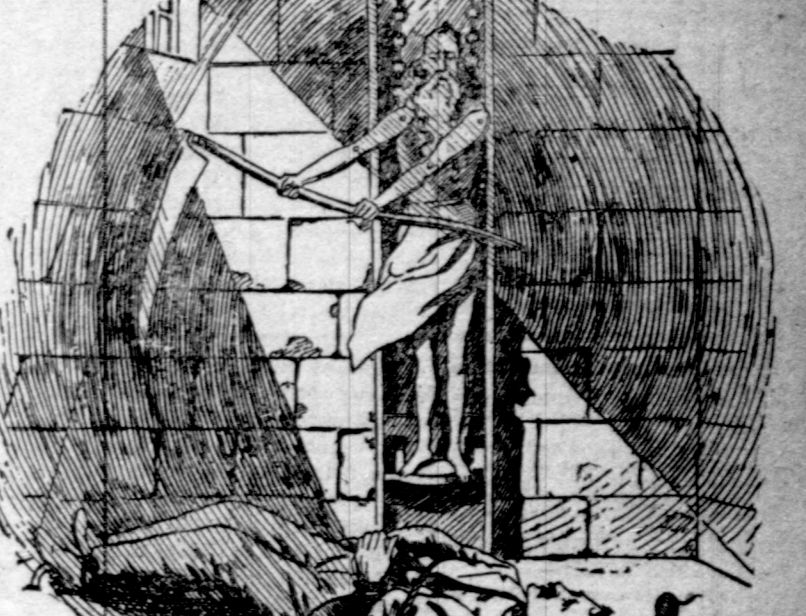

There is now no way to get the ultimatum to Spain except through the English Ambassador.

2nd District Democratic Executive Committee.

OFFICIAL CALL MADE.

Precinct and County Convention Will Be Held Prior To A District Convention.

TO BE HELD IN HENDERSON ON JUNE 29.

Tuesday the Democratic Executive Committee of the Second Congressional District met in this city to decide upon a plan of nominating a candidate for Congress.

Every County Represented.

Every county was represented either in person or proxy. The committee members present were: For Christian, Isaac Garrott, of Pembroke; Davies, S. G. Small, Owensboro; Hancock, W. W. Tabor, Hawesville; (proxy) Hopkins, W. D. Cook, Madisonville; Henderson, H. M. Stanley, Henderson; (proxy) McLean, R. G. Higdon, Calhoun; (proxy) Union, W. O. Hayes, Morgantown; Webster, H. H. Crosby, holding W. C. Harwick's proxy.

It was decided to issue the following Official Call.

1. It is hereby ordered that on the 26th day of June, 1898, at 2 o'clock p. m., standard time, there shall be held at each voting precinct of the Second Congressional District, at the usual voting places, a precinct convention for the purpose of appointing delegates to a County Convention, which will in turn appoint delegates to a District Convention called to nominate a Democratic candidate for Congress.

2. Each precinct shall be allowed one delegate vote for each fifty votes and fraction over twenty-five cast for the Bryan electors in 1896, provided that each precinct shall have at least one delegate vote.

3. The delegate votes of the county shall be "pro-rated" or divided in such manner as to express the will of the voters, as shown by their votes in the precinct conventions. The representation of the several counties is hereby fixed upon the basis of one delegate vote for each 250 votes and fraction over 100 votes cast for the Bryan Electors in 1896.

4. All persons who supported the Bryan electors in 1896, and all persons who desire to come into the regular Democratic organization, and who will agree to support the nominee of the convention, and all persons who are not now 21 years of age but who will be entitled to vote at the November election 1898, and who will agree to support the nominee of the convention herein called, shall be entitled to vote in said precinct conventions. The delegates chosen at said precinct conventions on June 26th, shall meet in county conventions at their respective county seats at two o'clock p. m., Monday, June 27th, 1898, and appoint delegates to a district convention hereinafter called to assemble in the city of Henderson on Wednesday, June 29th, 1898, at one o'clock p. m.

The representation of the several counties in said district convention shall be as follows:

Christian 16, Davies 25, Hancock 5, Henderson 10, Hopkins 17, McLean 7, Union 17, Webster 12.

A Special Committee From Nashville Comes to Hopkinsville.

The special committee, composed of Judge Ferris, Justice M. N. Brown, C. A. Sharenberger, John M. Ozanne and T. J. Moran, appointed by the County Court to investigate and adopt a cheap plan for heating, lighting and supplying the county asylum with water, visited yesterday the Western Kentucky Hospital, at Hopkinsville, and made a thorough investigation of that institution.

Mr. Brown, of the committee, said to-day that there were confined in the Kentucky Hospital 650 patients, as against 300 in the Davidson County Institution, and the cost used for heating, lighting and pumping water for the Kentucky asylum was \$12,000 a year.

Judge Ferris said the Davidson County asylum coal bill and repairs for these departments was something like \$14,000 a year.

The pumping station of the Kentucky asylum is a mile and a half and the reservoir a mile from the building. Mr. Brown said the Kentucky asylum had recently adopted the Webster system and was now arranging to put this in, because the authorities believed the cost could be reduced by this system.—Nashville Banner.
