

### the Summer Stage program

Thirteen years ago, the Arkansas Legislature appropriated funding for academic enrichment for the gifted in summer. The AEGIS programs that have since been developed have allowed thousands of Arkansas high school and junior high students to participate in a wide range of activities that they might not normally encounter during a regular school year. Program topics include Indian artifacts, foreign language, computers, and our personal favorite--performing arts.

In the last three weeks, these 49 students have seen live performances of BEEHIVE, a revue of 60's music, FOREVER PLAID, a revue of 50's music, and THE FOREIGNER, an engaging comedy. They have worked and interacted with professional artists, directors, performers, and teachers. They have explored their own primary areas of expertise, as well as areas in which they may be less knowledgeable. But more importantly, they have converged from all over this state to form the company you will see tonight.

### Story Synopsis

The short story, "The Open Window", by Saki, is the playful tale of a young girl's unusual way to get rid of an unwanted guest. Like most of Saki's other stories, "The Open Window" places an upper-class character in the role of protagonist and takes an interesting look at high society life. "The Open Window" focuses on the character Vera's mischievous specialty, "romance at short notice".

The unsuspecting Mr. Nuttel comes to Mrs. Sappleton's home for a relaxing visit to calm his nerves, but his very brief stay is anything but relaxing. While waiting for Mrs. Sappleton, he is entertained by Vera, her niece. Vera tells him the tragic tale of the open window in the room where they are talking.

Vera explains that it is the anniversary of her uncles' untimely deaths in a hunting accident. She informs Nuttel that her aunt is delusional and still expects the men and their old spaniel to

return by the window, as they always have.

Mr. Nuttel believes every word of Vera's story when Mrs. Sappleton begins to talk about the men's return. Finally, the hunting party does appear, and Mr. Nuttel believes he is seeing ghosts. He quickly leaves the house in a state of panic and confusion. Once again, Vera spins a dramatic tale, this time for her aunt's benefit, about Nuttel's great fear of dogs in order to explain his abrupt behavior.

## Saki (H. H. Munro)

Born in Burma on December 18, 1870, Saki was sent as a child to live with his aunts in Britain, where he was educated in the public school system until his father's return from foreign service. His father then undertook his education, and they traveled extensively throughout Europe.

Being the youngest son, Munro could not receive a prestigious military assignment, but because of his father's high rank, he given a post with the Burma Police, resigning after only one

year of service.

Munro began his first writing project, a history of medieval Russia, in 1899, but it was not taken seriously. In 1900, he began to write satires to accompany political illustrations in the Westminster Gazette. At this time, he adopted the pen name Saki, the name of the cupbearer to the gods in The Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam.

At the outbreak of World War I in 1914, Munro enlisted in the armed forces. He was killed in action in 1916. Saki is considered by many to be one of literature's great losses. It is believed that,

if not for his early death, he would have had many literary achievements.

## Director's Note

Both of the one-act plays are based on "The Open Window". "A Fine Line Between Fact and Fantasy", by Lisa-Marie Lames, is the story of what might have taken place the next day. "The Suitors", by Roark Maynard, follows the plot line of "The Open Window" with different characters in a similar situation.
