This compendium is intended to assist graduate students at the University of Minnesota who have an interest in the field of urban and regional planning. It is hoped that the listings will be helpful for all students who have interest in this field regardless of their particular major. It is also intended to be a guide for students whose major field is planning.

With the heightened awareness of the need for future growth and development that is sustainable in ecological, economic and social terms, greater and greater interest is evolving in the field of urban and regional planning. Urban and Regional planning is a profession that seeks to apply systematic, interdisciplinary thinking and knowledge to the problems and challenges posed by the interaction of the natural and man-made environment. The field is concerned with the design and development of human settlements based on a firm understanding of their dynamics and interrelationships. Urban planning seeks to manage growth and change to improve the quality of life for all members of society. From its historical concern with city design, land use and public infrastructure, the breadth of planning has expanded such that today it includes economic development, housing, social policy, transportation, and the environment.

The University of Minnesota has many teaching units that offer course work relating to the field of urban and regional planning. The purpose of this compendium is to provide a ready reference for those students—particularly at the graduate level—who wish to take courses that related to various aspects of the field. The compendium is organized into two main sections: first, courses are listed by subject areas within the planning field; second, courses are listed by department. Full descriptions of the courses, together with the instructor's name and any prerequisites, are available in the Graduate School Bulletin: 1997-1999.

At the present time, the only graduate degree in urban and regional planning at the University is offered through the Humphrey Institute. This program leads to the Master of Planning degree and is fully accredited by the Planning Accreditation Board, a national accrediting body sponsored by the American Planning Association, the American Institute of Certified Planners and the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning.
