Procedure

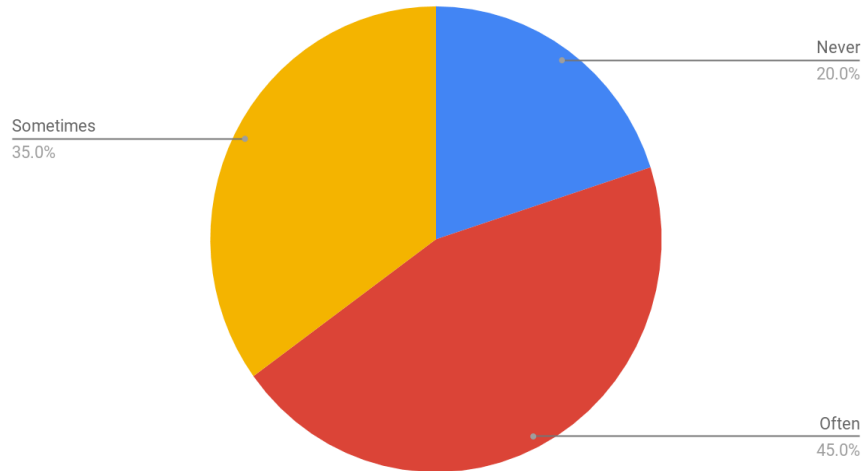
To gather data for our study we surveyed people at random twice and conducted several in-person interviews.



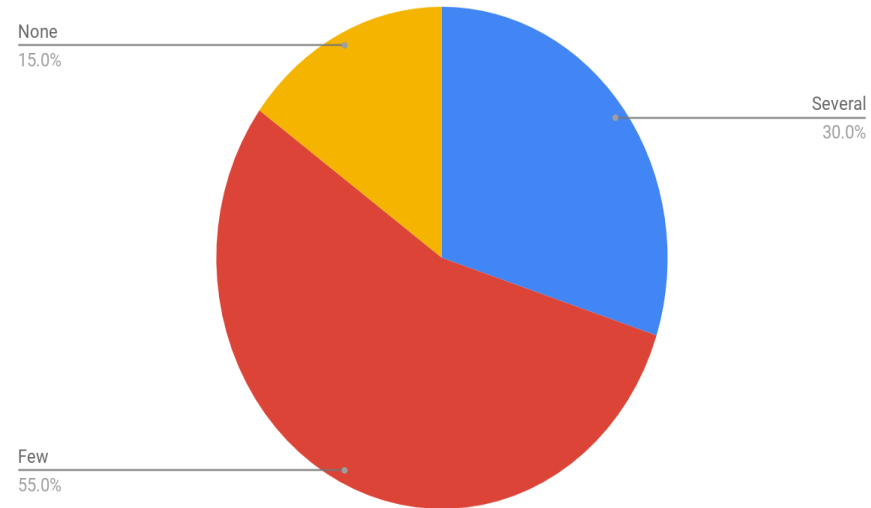

How Often Parkland Students Socialize Outside of Class



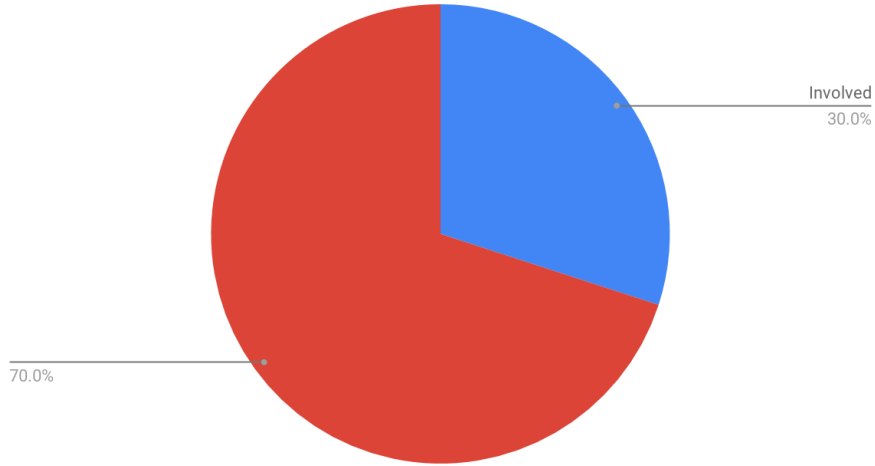
Good Friends Made at Parkland



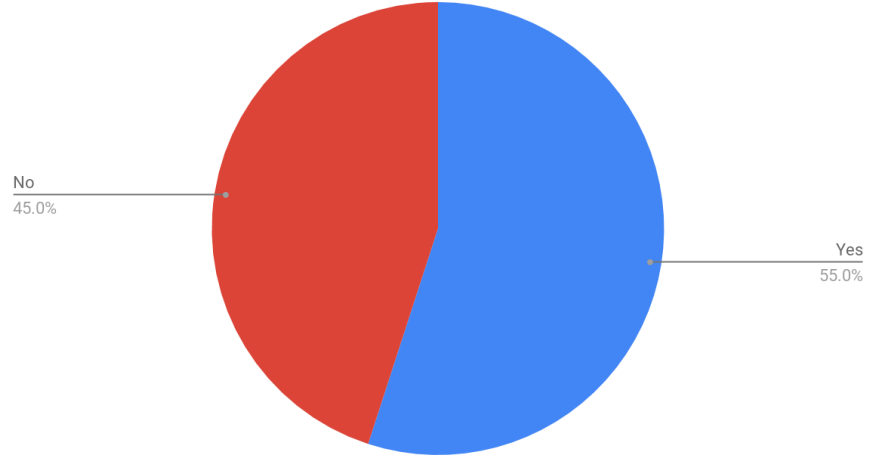

Parkland Student Involvement in Clubs



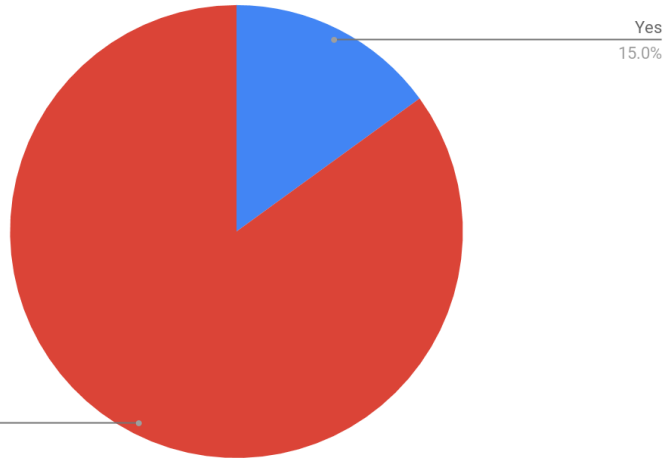
Percent of Parkland Students Actively Seeking Friendships
