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## Join the Garden Hills Homework Club!

For the past twelve years, students, faculty, and staff of Parkland College have been working with 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders at an afterschool program called the Homework Club at Garden Hills Elementary. The Homework Club, a partnership between Parkland College and Champaign Unit 4 Schools, meets two days a week (Mondays and Wednesdays), from 3:00-4:00pm. We are currently recruiting members of the Parkland community to volunteer one or two days a week throughout the upcoming fall semester. Volunteers provide not only academic support to the Garden Hills kids, but also serve as important role models to at-risk youth. As a result of the success of previous semesters, our primary goal this term is to increase the number of Parkland College students working with Garden Hills students.

In the 2018-2019 school year, over 50 Parkland students and staff volunteered with the Homework Club, and we hope to have even more join us next term!
