FATHER DAY'S BROADCAST (2)

From the religious awakening of the world, with the advent of the Bible, the word "father" was the chief source of material for writing. This great book is a true romance of fatherhood. The word "father" appears 1,650 times in the Bible. Mrs. Dodd, the former Sonora Louise Smart, merely obeyed one of the commandments--"Honor Thy Father"--when she suggested to the Spokane Ministerial Association that the third Sunday in June be set aside to honor father.

I salute Mrs. Dodd, who is with me today, for her work, her faith and patience in shaping an intangible idea into actual reality--a day to pay homage to Dad.

This city is ideal for such a program. It is the birthplace of the idea, and here are the monuments which perpetuate the annual observance. Here, too, we are broadcasting almost in the shadow of the father mountain--Mount Spokane--which will remain a monument, not only to the forces of nature which created it, but also to fathers everywhere who inspired its rechristening in 1930. Here, too, developed the idea of planting trees to honor living fathers, and as a memorial to fathers whose early work has ended.

There can be no meaningful Father's Day, however, until the return of fathers now in uniform. The national committee for this Father's Day honors one of these gallant ~~and brave~~ American soldier-fathers, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, commander of the Allied forces in North Africa, as the outstanding father of the year for his "sterling qualities of leadership and his inspiration to the youth of today."
