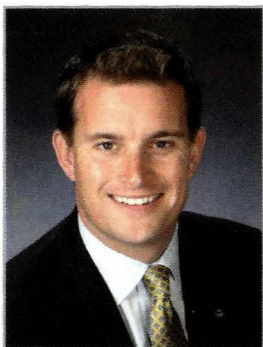

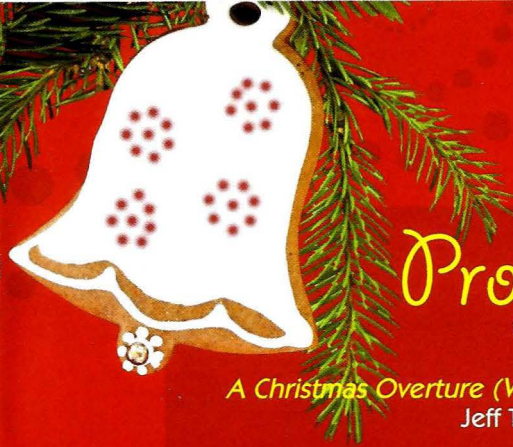

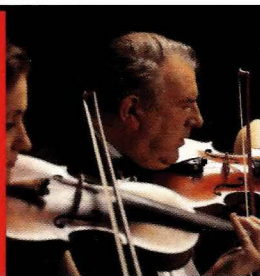


The Friends of the Conservatory of Music

The Lynn University Conservatory of Music

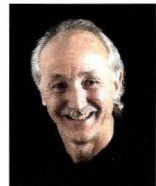

About Our Lynn University Philharmonia Orchestra

The Lynn University Philharmonia Orchestra sets the standard for conservatory level symphonic training. Now in its 17th season as a full symphony, the Philharmonia is an integral part of the education of the conservatory's graduate and undergraduate music students. Each year, the Philharmonia presents a high-quality concert series with a wide range of repertoire.

Albert-George Schram, artistic director and conductor

A native of the Netherlands, Albert-George Schram is resident conductor of the Columbus (Ohio) Symphony Orchestra and resident conductor of the Nashville Symphony. He also is a frequent guest conductor at the Charlotte (N.C.) Symphony Orchestra and Tucson Symphony Orchestra in Arizona. His foreign conducting engagements have included the KBS Symphony Orchestra, the Taegu Symphony Orchestra in Korea, and the Orchester der Allgemeinen Musikgesellschaft Luzern in Switzerland. Schram's studies have been largely in the European tradition under the tutelage of Franco Ferrara, Rafael Kubelik, Abraham Kaplan and Neeme Jarvi. He has studied at the Conservatory of the Hague in the Netherlands, the universities of Calgary and Victoria, and the University of Washington, where he received the Doctor of Musical Arts in conducting.
