

Kaitlin Richardson was born in Michigan, the second child of a musical family. She began playing the violin at age four. Kaitlin's first teacher was Anne Dodge, one of the first American students of Sinichi Suzuki. Kaitlin continued

her violin studies with Lenore Sjoberg, Margaret Tundo, and Kimberly Kennedy, all members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. Kaitlin was a member of the Metropolitan Youth Symphony and the Oakland Youth Orchestra, where she won the 2005 Concerto Competition. She also served as concertmistress of the Detroit Symphony Civic Orchestra and the Detroit Symphony Civic Orchestra String Quartet. After graduating, she spent two summers at the Bowdoin International Music Festival under the instruction of Sergiu Schwartz with whom she studied at Lynn University and Columbus State University. Kaitlin is currently pursuing a Master's degree at Lynn University with Professor Carol Cole.
