

Adam Diderrich grew up in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where he started playing violin at age 5. In 2003 he completed his Bachelor of Music degree and the Professional Performance Certificate at the University of Toronto while studying with professor Atis Bankas. From 2004 to 2007 Adam performed with the New World Symphony

in Miami Beach. Since that time he has been an active freelance musician in South Florida. He performs with many groups, including Palm Beach Opera, the Palm Beach Symphony, Palm Beach Pops, Atlantic Classical Orchestra, Southwest Florida Symphony, the Naples Philharmonic, Florida Grand Opera, and Seraphic Fire. Adam has been studying with Elmar Oliveira at Lynn University since September of 2008. Adam also plays styles of music other than classical. He loves improvising and recently finished collaborating on a blues album.

Tao Lin's appearances in Asia, North America and Europe have brought unanimous critical accolades and praise for his subtle, intimate pianism and brilliant technique. A versatile musician, he is equally at home as soloist, recitalist and chamber musician. As a soloist, he has performed with Moscow Chamber Orchestra, Winnipeg Symphony, Miami Chamber Orchestra, Knoxville Civic Orchestra, University of Miami Symphony, Harid Philharmonia, and Lynn University Chamber Orchestra. A devoted chamber musician, Mr. Lin has concertized throughout the United States as a founding member (with Jacques Thibaud String Trio) of the Berlin Piano Quartet. He has also appeared in concerts with Miami, Bergonzi, Alcan, and Rosalyra String Quartets as well as distinguished musicians such as Ida Haendel, Elmar Oliveira, Charles Castleman, Roberta Peters, Eugenia Zukerman, Shunske Sato, Claudio Bohorquez, Philip Quint and members of Metropolitan Opera, Philadelphia, St. Louis, National, Minnesota, Pittsburg, Berlin Staatskaplle Orchestras. A regular guest artist at numerous music festivals, Mr. Lin has performed at the Music Festival of the Hamptons, Mainly Mozart Festival, Music Mountain Chamber Music Festival, Arts Rolla Festival, Highlands-Cashiers Chamber Music Festival, and Bowdoin International Music Festival. He is currently Head of the Collaborative Piano Program at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University. He has recorded for Piano Lovers, Romeo, and Poinciana labels.
