Born in Reynosa, Mexico, David started his viola studies at the age of 14 through the National Youth Orchestra program in Mexico under Jose Vazquez. After spending four years in this program, he auditioned for the Escuela Superior de Musica y Danza to study with Alicher

Kamilov. In 2001, he won a full scholarship to study with Doris Lederer of the Audubon Quartet at Shenandoah Conservatory.

In 2003, after an international audition, David was invited to the Youth Orchestra of the Americas under Placido Domingo. Subsequently, he performed with them during the summer seasons of 2003-2005. David has won prizes from the MTNA competition and from the State of Tamaulipas in Mexico and participated in the 2006 Lionel Tertis International Viola Competition. He has participated in master classes of Carol Rodland, Jeffrey Irvine, Roberto Diaz, and Kim Kashkashian. On tour, he has played in the following countries: Mexico, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Ecuador, Venezuela, Brazil, Uruguay, Argentina, Peru and the UK. In the summer of 2007, David was a Performing Associate at the Bowdoin International Music Festival. Currently, he is enrolled in the Master of Music program at Lynn University as a full scholarship student of Ralph Fielding.


