He has performed with the New York Philharmonic, Cleveland Orchestra, The Philadelphia Orchestra, NHK Orchestra in Tokyo, Dallas Symphony, Oregon Symphony, Seattle Symphony, and with the major orchestras of Baltimore, Boston, Cincinnati, Los Angeles, and Minneapolis. He toured Canada with Pinchas Zukerman and the National Arts Centre Orchestra, and performed with the Tokyo Quartet and Joshua Bell. Parker has recorded for Telarc with André Previn, Yoel Levi, and Peter Schickele. A versatile performer, he has jammed with Doc Severinsen and Bobby McFerrin, and collaborated with Audra McDonald and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Mr. Parker was awarded his country's highest honor, the Order of Canada, in 1999.
