Violist Wallas Pena is a native of Brazil. He is currently pursuing his undergraduate degree at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music with Ralph Fielding. He has participated in many music festivals, such as the Campos do Jordao Winter Festival, the Pocos de Caldas Music Festival and the Curitiba Music festival. He has been invited to participate in international orchestras such as the Youth Orchestra of the Americas and the Jeunesses Musicales World Orchestra. Wallas is the Winner of the Florida State Music Teachers Association Competition, as well as the Orchestra Experimental de Repertorio Solo Competition.

He recently was a prize winner at the 2006 Lionel Tertis International Viola

Competition, one of the most prestigious competitions for viola.

He has appeared as soloist with the Experimental Orchestra, Sao Paulo State Youth Orchestra, Sao Caetano Philharmonic, Britten Orchestra and the University of Sao Paulo Symphonic Orchestra.
