Distinguished Alumni Award recipient, Wayne Jarvis '96

Wayne Jarvis, class of 1996, is receiving the 2017 Distinguished Alumni Award for exemplary loyalty and service to his alma mater. Jarvis is a two-time recipient of the honor, first earning it in 2003.

Jarvis is general manager of Kraeer Funeral Home in Pompano Beach, Florida, which is part of Dignity Memorial, North America's largest funeral services provider.

A native of Fairhaven, Massachusetts, Jarvis moved to South Florida in 1983 for the warm climate and employment in the hospitality industry. He worked for several years as food and beverage manager at The Breakers and Hilton. Several years later, at 29, Jarvis discovered his true calling while helping his mother with his father's funeral arrangements. The funeral director's compassion and professionalism made a lasting impression, inspiring Jarvis to change careers. "I saw the value in what he was doing—helping a family through one of the most devastating times in their lives."

For his studies, Jarvis chose Lynn University. "I fell in love with Lynn at first sight," he said. "You could feel the energy of the student body. The campus was beautiful, friendly and welcoming. I knew I could flourish in that type of environment. And I was right."

Jarvis earned his degree while working two jobs. Since graduating, Jarvis has been a leader not only in his profession but also at his alma mater. He served as president of the alumni board for 12 years and today is a member of the Leadership Society and the President's Alumni Advisory Council.

Jarvis enjoys giving back to his university. He and his husband, Michael Valchuis, have supported student scholarships through an annual gift and a bequest to the Alumni Pay It Forward Endowed Scholarship. Established in 2016, the scholarship is awarded to deserving students, who, like Jarvis, chose Lynn in order to achieve their dreams.

"You never know how a scholarship will change a student's life," Jarvis said, "but you do know it will."



Speakers

Commencement speaker, Robert Watson

Dr. Robert Watson is professor of American studies in the College of Arts and Sciences at Lynn University and an author, media commentator and community activist.

Following the 2016 presidential campaign, which he believes to be the most divisive since the 1860s, Watson developed Project Civitas at Lynn to promote civility in politics and public life through education in and outside the classroom. Initiatives include having the mayor of Boca Raton declare March to be Civility Month, hosting "Dialogues in Civility" programs complementing Lynn's Dialogues core curriculum, and encouraging leaders and communities to take a civility pledge.

"We will never be able to address the issues facing our country if we are unable to have open, courteous and fact-based conversations," Watson said. "A healthy democracy requires a commitment to cooperation and the ability to compromise."

A noted historian, Watson has published more than 40 books and hundreds of scholarly articles, book chapters and essays. His book *America's First Crisis* won book of the year in history at the Independent Publishers Awards, and his current book, *The Nazi Titanic*, has been featured at leading book festivals and is up for several awards. He has co-convened a half-dozen national conferences on the American presidency, moderated political debates and forums, and delivered more than 1,500 keynote addresses, town hall programs and lectures. He is the founder of three nonprofit think tanks dedicated to civic education, political reform and fact-checking campaign lies.

Media outlets including CNN, NBC, *The New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *Time* and the BBC have interviewed Watson thousands of times. Watson is the editor of SUNY Press' book series on the American presidents and edits and directs the encyclopedia sets *American Presidents* and *American First Ladies* for Salem Press/Grey House Publishing.

Watson has served on scholarly journal boards, academic associations and both community and presidential foundations. He is the founding editor of *White House Studies* and has offered countless free History Day programs for K–12 schools, teacher training workshops on civics, and town halls on politics for the community.

Student speaker, Calvin L. Jordan Jr. '17

Calvin L. Jordan Jr. is graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in advertising and public relations.

Jordan was born in Portsmouth, Virginia. Because of his father's job in the United States Coast Guard, he also has lived in Alaska, Hawaii and Florida. Currently, he and his family call Deerfield Beach. Florida, home.

Jordan describes himself as a "people person," which explains his choice of major and extensive campus involvement, including editor-in-chief of the student newspaper *iPulse*; agency director of the student PR/advertising agency, Pulse Agency; parliamentarian knight, Knights of the Roundtable; and actor in campus drama productions and annual Celebration of the Arts. He enjoys singing, dancing and playing instruments—at last count, 11.

Jordan has been equally accomplished academically. Enrolled in the accelerated bachelor's degree program, he completed his undergraduate degree in two and a half years. He is the recipient of three scholarships: the Dean's Scholarship, the Snyder Endowed Scholar and the Earl A. and Madira Bickel Journalistic Scholarship. He currently is pursuing a Master of Science in communication and media in the Eugene M. and Christine E. Lynn College of International Communication, where he serves as a graduate assistant.

At Lynn, Jordan found an excellent professional network among his classmates and professors that led to three internships—the latter with TilsonPR in Boca Raton. He also was a contributing writer for *The Palm Beach Post*. Recently, he was offered a full-time position with TilsonPR.

Long-term, Jordan envisions working for the federal government or as college professor. He is considering applying to law school. A definite plan is to stay involved with Lynn. "Lynn has given so much to me. I'd like to help out by giving back by networking, sharing advice or teaching. From time to time, I'll stop in and find out what's new because there's always something new here."

And he has this advice for future Lynn students: "Take advantage of all that's given to you and run with it."

Traditions

2017 class gift

Each year, members of the graduating class leave behind a gift symbolizing their time at Lynn. The class of 2017 continues this proud tradition by contributing to the Alumni Pay It Forward Endowed Scholarship. Established in 2016, the scholarship is awarded to a first-year student who is in good academic standing and in need of financial assistance. The university is grateful to the graduating class of 2017 for "paying it forward" so that other students can one day fulfill their potential and achieve success in the world.

Academic regalia

The academic robes and hoods worn by the faculty and students lend color to the pageantry of commencement. This regalia dates back into the medieval ages, when it served a functional as well as an ornamental role, separating the learned men from other groups and offering warmth and protection.

In America in the late 19th century, representatives of colleges and universities held a conference to bring order and system to the custom of academic dress. Since then, there have been periodic conferences to revise or reconfirm existing practices.

Undergraduates wear the black robes with the white collars. Holders of the master's degree wear hoods, which are lined with the colors of the college conferring the degree and trimmed with the color representing the subject in which the degree was earned. The doctoral robe is adorned with velvet and is also worn with the hood suitably ornamented.

Holders of degrees from foreign universities or religious orders wear the entire academic costume as decreed by the conferring institution.

The gonfalons

The gonfalons, a tradition that originated in the civic rituals of 12th century Italy, are a part of Lynn University's academic ceremonial protocol.

Lynn University designed the gonfalons in accordance with the standards established for all colleges and universities, and each bears the college's unique symbolic color. The university seal is presented on each gonfalon to embody the common bonds that unite faculty and students as members of one academic community. The vice president for academic affairs, in consultation with the academic deans, selects the faculty members honored to serve as gonfalon bearers.

The ceremonial academic mace

The academic mace dates back to the 14th century, when royalty, magistrates, and church or university officials carried maces in official processions. The design of the ceremonial academic mace incorporates elements from royal scepters and battle maces, representing both leadership and strength.

During the commencement ceremony, the mace indicates the authority of the university president to award degrees. The chief marshal carries the mace.

The Lynn University mace consists of a three-foot-tall wood scepter with a bronze cast of the Lynn University seal on the top. It was designed in 2002 by Graphic Design Professor Emeritus Ernest Ranspach, who presented it to then-Lynn University President Donald E. Ross in honor of 30 years of leadership and service.

The university presents this award to the graduating senior who exhibits outstanding leadership and the potential for a successful career in fashion marketing.

The Robert M. Sandelman Award in Marketing

The university presents this award to the student who displays outstanding potential for scholarship and leadership in the field of marketing.

The Gordon and Mary Henke Excellence in Communication Award

This award recognizes the student who has excelled in the communications program and has the potential for an outstanding career in the field of communications.

The James J. Oussani Award

The university presents this award to the student deemed most innovative and motivated in completing a degree program.

The Dean's Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Education

Each college, The Burton D. Morgan School of Aeronautics and the Conservatory of Music present this award to the graduate who displays outstanding potential for scholarship and leadership in his or her respective field.

The Undergraduate Day Division Award

The university presents this award to the undergraduate degree candidate who has attained the highest cumulative grade point average for his or her entire degree course work. Students must have earned 90 credits or more at Lynn to be eligible for this award.

The President's Award

The university presents this award to the student exhibiting extraordinary service and commitment to Lynn University.

The Trustees' Medal

The university bestows this medal upon a student who has exhibited outstanding scholarship, leadership, loyalty and service to Lynn University.
