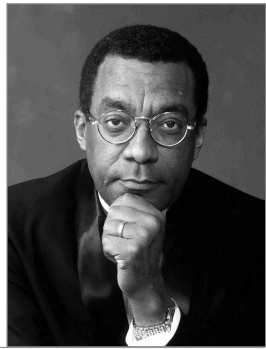

Competition, Boca Raton, FL. Ciprian has been performed in a recital at Council of Europe, Strasbourg France, Paganini Conservatory Concert Hall, Genova, Italy, Youth Orchestra of Ilmenau, Germany, Recitals at FIMU, Belfort, France, and Weber Concertino – with Lynn Philharmonia at Spanish River Church Concert Hall, Florida. He also participated to FIMU, Belfort, France festival, International Contemporary Music Festival, Romania, International Music Festival in Brasov, Romania having the great honor to work with Klenyan Csaba, Stefan Korody, Ioan Goila, Emil Visenescu, Franklin Cohen, and Paul Green. Presently, he is attending Bachelor's Music Program at Lynn University under Mr. Richard Hancock's guidance.

Flutist **David Suarez** has performed recitals and concerts in Puerto Rico, Mexico and Vermont. He was first prize winner in the Florida Flute Association Young Artist Competition and semi-finalist in the New York String Seminar, part of the Schneider Concert Series in New York City. He has participated in the International Casals Festival Orchestra in Puerto Rico, The Manchester Music Festival in Vermont and the Bi-National Symphony Orchestra in Mexico. Mr. Suarez has also participated in master classes with world renowned flutists, James Walker, Peter Lloyd, William Bennett and Paula Robinson. Currently he is a student of Tina Burr at The Conservatory of Music at Lynn University. His is founding member of Élan Chamber Players, a local group whose collective goal is to enrich the cultural life of the community, through chamber music performances.

Charles Swan began musical studies on the piano at the age of five, and began playing the oboe at the age of twelve. He is currently pursuing his Professional Performance Certificate in oboe at Lynn Conservatory where he studies with Jared Hauser. Mr. Swan's orchestral credits include performing as acting principal oboe for the San Angelo Symphony Orchestra, and oboe and English horn with the Las Vegas Music Festival. He has also appeared with the Big Spring Symphony Orchestra, Plainview Symphony Orchestra, Caprock Promusica Symphony Orchestra and the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra, Boca Symphonia, Symphony of the Americas, New Philharmonic, and Orchestra Camerata Ducale. Prior to moving to Boca Raton, Charles completed his Bachelor's degree in Music Performance at Texas Tech University of Lubbock, Texas where he was as principal oboe with the Symphony Orchestra and Symphonic Wind Ensemble as well as a finalist in their concerto competition. He was also chosen as the alternate in the Lynn concerto competition in 2006.

Veroslav Taskov is a native of Bulgaria and graduate of the Sofia Music Conservatory. Mr. Taskov is a winner of three national and one international oboe competitions. Mr. Taskov has toured in more than 30 states and 14 countries around the world. He has been second oboe player in Sofia National Opera orchestra, New Symphony Orchestra and has performed with over a dozen orchestras worldwide. He is currently completing his Professional Performance Certificate Program at Lynn University. His teachers include Yasen Enchev, Georgi Jeliarov and Jared Hauser.

Nick Thompson was born in St. Louis, Mo. on April 21, 1983. A very musical family prompted him to pick up the oboe at age 11. In high school, he performed in the St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra. Nick received his undergraduate degree in performance at the University of Miami, FL. He has also done graduate work at FIU, and now pursues a Professional Performance Certificate from Lynn Conservatory, studying with Jared Hauser. Other achievements include making the sub-list for the New World Symphony, and continually playing with various ensembles around southern Florida, such as Symphony of Americas, and Miami City Ballet.

Girard Moses Villanueva started learning the clarinet at an early age. At eight he gave his first clarinet recital and at ten, he competed and won the National Music Competition for Young Artists (NAMCYA) held at the Cultural Center of the Philippines. He was accepted at the Philippine High School for the Arts (PHSA) as a full scholar. His mentor was Dr. Dalmacio Cruz, former principal clarinetist of the Philippine Philharmonic Orchestra. His recital at the Fransisco Santiago Hall earned an ovation led by National Artist for Music Andrea Veneracion who praised his virtuosity. On the summer of 2001 he attended the Pucheon Music Festival held at Pusan Korea. Girard graduated Most Outstanding Musician in his class. He was awarded scholarship to continue his studies in the United States at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University in Boca Raton in 2002 where he studied with Artist-faculty Paul Green. In 2003 he won in the Mizner Scholarship Competition. In the summer of 2007, Girard Moses joined the American Wind Symphony Orchestra that toured the east coast. Throughout his undergraduate degree Girard has been a member of the Honors Colloquium where he was awarded twice under the President's HONORS society. Girard Moses graduated Summa Cum Laude and is currently pursuing his Master's degree under Artist-faculty Richard Hancock.

Carlos Felipe Viña began his musical studies at the Conservatorio de Música Del Tolima when he was 11 years old where he received his high school diploma in 2000. In 2001 Mr. Viña moved to Bogota, in order to study at the Universidad Nacional de Colombia earning his Bachelor of Music Degree. Mr. Viña performed with the Orquesta Sinfónica de Colombia and the Banda Sinfónica de Cundinamarca as first chair bassoon. He has also been invited as an extra for the Orquesta Filarmónica de Bogota and Orquesta Sinfónica de Colombia; invited as a soloist with the Orquesta Sinfónica Del Conservatorio de Música Del Tolima and Orquesta Sinfónica Universidad E.A.F.I.T. In 2004 Mr. Viña won the series of concerts *Lunes de los Jovenes Interpretes* from the Luis Angel Arango Library and won the youth soloist competition with the Orquesta Filarmónica del Valle in 2006. Mr. Viña frequently performs recitals throughout Colombia. His teachers have been Roberto Trujillo, Jaime Cuellar and Jorge Jaramillo. Mr. Viña is presently in his first year of study at Lynn University Conservatory pursuing his Professional Performance Certificate with Michael Ellert.
